



Gilbert Rushubirwa Mashurano, the new associate pastor of St. Raymond de Penafort, a Catholic Faith Community in Mount Prospect. I was born and raised in Africa in Tanzania, in the eastern part of Africa. I'm the middle child of two brothers. My family members live in Tanzania. My mother is a teacher, and teaches sixth and seventh grades. My two brothers work for the Tanzanian government. I came to the United States of America as a seminarian of the Archdiocese of Chicago, and I was sent to St. Joseph College Seminary of Loyola University in Chicago to study for two semesters. I then moved to St. Mary of the Lake University in Mundelein to continue with my studies for a master's degree. I completed my

Field Education at St. Clotilde Parish and St. Kilian Parish on the Southside of Chicago, and my Pastoral Internship at Our Lady of Loretto in Hometown. I did my Clinical Pastoral Education at The Christ Hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio. I was ordained to the Diaconate in October, 2011. I did a part of my weekend parochial ministry as a deacon at St. Eulalia Parish in Maywood. I was ordained to the priesthood on May 12, 2012 at Holy Name Cathedral by His Eminence, Francis Cardinal George. On July 1st, 2012 I was assigned to St. James Parish in Arlington Heights. I have been at Saint James Parish for five years. I am excited to join St. Raymond de Penafort. I will bring my five years of pastoral experience from St. James Parish to St. Raymond de Penafort school, religious education, spiritual life, faith formation, human concerns, altar server training, devotion groups (rosary, adoration, Knights of Columbus), helping at nursing homes, homebound ministry-ministry of care, Kairos Retreats, and adult formation. I'm looking forward to being a part of this great Catholic community of St. Raymond and learning about the parish history, neighborhood, staff, and pastoral activities of the parish. 



3 Easy Ways to Celebrate Father's Day Every Day

As Father's Day draws near, take a few moments to think about what it means for you, as a parent, to love your kids. Many parents get caught up in the whirlwind of after school activities, planning for fun-filled vacations, working hard to save for their future, and buying things that bring smiles to their faces.

While these actions spring from a heart filled with love, there are three very simple ways to love your kids that make a difference everyday:

1. Tell your kids you love them.

Tell your kids you love them by actually saying the words—all the time. One of the ways kids learn best is through repetition. Saying "I love you" to them several times a day will help them know and trust that you really do love them.

Try lunch bag notes: <u>Lunch Bag Notes</u> or <u>More Lunch Bag Notes</u>

2. Love your kids by listening to them.

<u>Turn off the TV, get off the computer</u>, and spend at least ten meaningful minutes each day listening closely to your son or daughter. Find out what made him or her feel happy or bad during the day, and what he or she is thinking about right now. Give your children the gifts of your time and your ear. It's important for children to know that you belong just to them for at least a little bit each day.

Get your kids talking at the dinner table with <u>The Meal Box</u>.

3. Remind your kids that there is someone who loves them even more than you do.

Tell them how much <u>Jesus loves them</u>—and keep on telling them. It's essential that kids be reminded of this amazing love on a daily basis. Knowing that they are beloved children of God will assure them that they not only have a special place in your family, they have an even more special place in God's family.

Introduce your children to God's love with these classic Bible verses for children.

Keep on doing whatever those "big" things are that you do to show your kids you love them, but don't overlook the "little" things that show your love for them. After all, the little things ARE the big things.

Registration for the Fall 2017-18 Religious Education year is now open!

It's that time of year again! Registration for the 2017-18 Religious Education Program is now open. We ask that all families at this time please complete all the necessary forms to ensure that your students will be registered.

Registrations are due by July 31st! Registrations received August 1st and after will be assessed a \$50 late fee.

All registrations received on/after August 1st- students will be placed in a class IF there is room. Otherwise we will create a waiting list in the hopes we can find more volunteer Catechists. If we are unable to find Catechists for any remaining grades that need them, those students on the Waiting List will go into Home Study.

There are two parts to complete your registration:

- Completing the online registration form.
- Setting up a payment schedule Smart Tuition. *Families who do not set up a payment schedule via Smart Tuition (or pay in full by check) by July 31st will be assessed the \$50 Late Fee.*

Payment on Smart Tuition alone does not count as registration and will not reserve a space in class.
