

On Tuesday, August 15, we will celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is a Holy Day of obligation. Masses will be celebrated:

Tuesday, August 15th Holy Day Masses: 8:15 AM & 7:00 PM

There is a traditional blessing that follows this feast that connects our world of nature and abundance to the spirit of Divine fulfillment. Right now, across the United States and Europe, the harvest is being realized. Fruits and grains are slowly being gathered to feed and heal the world. We remember, as St. Paul writes in his letter to the Corinthians, that Jesus is the first fruit of the resurrection, the first to be raised.

On the Feast of The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we remember her being "harvested" into heaven. Because this time of year reflects the abundance of God while the fruits of the earth are slowly being harvested, we invite you to bring bright flowers and fragrant herbs from your garden to be blessed at the Mass you attend. By doing so, we hold onto the promise of the abundance of God's life and the gift of resurrection and the realization that we will be gathered into God's kingdom. 

Started by Karen Bychowski, To Africa with Love aims to connect, care and contribute to the people of East Africa and beyond.



Having lived and worked in Nairobi, Kenya from 2007 – 2008, Karen's love of this part of the world – and God's specific hand in calling her there- was evident from the beginning.

Over the past ten years, Karen has returned to Kenya in various capacities, including several trips with Habitat for Humanity and other volunteer organizations.

To Africa with Love builds on these experiences and seeks to further the impact of these efforts.

Did you know? Almost one million girls in Kenya will miss school this year because they have their period and lack the resources and information to manage this natural process?

With an aim of reaching at least 500 girls between the ages of 12 - 22, **Pads with a Purpose** seeks to accomplish two primary goals:

- 1) Provide a **source of encouragement** to these young women, through the creation and discussion of individual vision boards. Tools that the girls can use to put their dreams and goals onto paper, and in to action.
- 2) Provide **supplies to help the girls** maintain focus on their vision, including sanitary napkins, reproductive health education and school supplies.

Swahili for market, the "Soko" is a collection of goods, including jewelry and home goods, sourced from Kenya and surrounding countries.

All products are priced based on "suggested donation," basis with proceeds going to fund the Pads with a Purpose Project.

WOMEN'S SPIRITUALITY CIRCLES

Women's Spirituality Circles are small groups of 8-18 women who gather once a month to nourish, reflect upon and share their own spiritual lives. A resource book is used, which enables the women to come to a deeper understanding of themselves and their own unique spirituality. Through reading, discussion and prayerful reflection, the women experience a deeper prayer life and the invitation to share their gifts in service to God's people. They gather strength, insight and a sense of gratitude from one another. Each group has a facilitator. MAC (MEN OF ACTION AND CONTEMPLATION)

MAC is a group of five or six men who commit themselves to meeting twice a month for one hour to dialogue, support and encourage each other to live the Gospel message more fully in their daily lives. A resource book, based on the daily scripture readings is used. Each daily reflection contains a part of a scripture reading, a contemporary story, a question for one's own life application and a concluding thought for the day. Each man is asked to find ten minutes each day to reflect and pray over the daily reflection. The men involved find that this experience helps them in their daily lives. Trust What You Know

Tips for New Catechists

When first approached with the invitation to become a catechist, many people respond with a variation on the same theme: "But I've never done that! I don't know how to teach, and I don't know enough about my religion to teach it." Veteran catechists will tell you that although formal training is undoubtedly helpful, some of the most important lessons a catechist needs to know come from personal experience.

Children look to adults for guidance and structure.

Establish your role early as the resident adult in matters of discipline and organization. While it's tempting to want to be their friend, the children need you to be their guide.

Know the content by heart.

You don't have to be a trained theologian to be a catechist, but it is necessary for you to be familiar with the content you will cover and to take it to heart prior to presenting it. It's best if you can discuss the content with another catechist or supportive believer, sharing your understanding and your faith before presenting the content to the children.

Actions speak louder than words.

The way you treat the children will make a greater impression on them than any session you lead. Respect, kindness, fairness, compassion, and forgiveness will reinforce the Christian message. Harshness and rigidity will undercut the gospel you present.

We learn in a variety of ways.

Catechesis includes a wide variety of information that children should become familiar with. As Catholic Christians, we learn about our faith in more ways than one—through story, symbol, ritual, song, prayer, and service. Be sure to include a variety of approaches when presenting the content.

Exercise children's religious imagination.

Children are naturally religious in their inclinations. They seldom have any trouble with hoping, dreaming, and imagining every possibility under heaven. Allow some elbow room for creative thinking as you draw them toward the ideas you want to present.


Don't just tell them—show them.

A valuable aspect of religious formation that the Church has reclaimed in the last generation or so is the irreplaceable dimension of faith sharing. Catechists have the opportunity not only of presenting the fundamentals of the faith but also of sharing the importance of it in their own lives. "Faith is not taught, but caught," as catechists say. Reflect on whose faith your own spiritual life is modeled after.

Make their time a positive experience.

You stand before these children as a representative of the Church. Their impressions of their time spent with you will become part of their understanding of what the Church is all about. If they remember this time as enlivening, exciting, and purposeful, they will associate that experience with what a life of faith entails. So get in touch with the excitement of your own faith and let that excitement shine forth in every session you lead.

The Dream Act of 2017, S. 1615, was recently introduced in the Senate. If passed into law, this bipartisan bill would protect immigrant youth who entered the U.S. as children with "conditional permanent resident status" and a path to full lawful permanent residency and eventual citizenship. This includes the 780,000 young people who received temporary relief from deportation and employment eligibility through the Department of Homeland Security's DACA program. These individuals are leaders in our parishes and communities, academic standouts in our universities, veterans of our military, and contributors to our economy.

ACTION: The Catholic Church believes in protecting the dignity of every human person and has long supported DREAMERS. Ask your senators to co-sponsor the Dream Act of 2017, by visiting the USCCB website www.JusticeforImmigrants.org.

AWARENESS

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

Does your partner isolate you from family and friends? Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused? Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse.", "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone." These are traps that keep people bound.
