Dear Parishioners,

This is a report on the finances and operations of St. Raymond de Penafort Parish for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2017. The report shows that the parish incurred an operating loss for the year just ended of slightly more than \$33,000. While this is a loss, it is a significant improvement over the prior year when we reported a loss of \$59,868. This was a direct result of a conscious decision to reduce expenses. We are heading in the right direction!

This year we were able to finish some repairs and updates that were badly needed across the campus. These included completing the final phase of replacing badly deteriorating windows and doors in the rectory; repair and renovation of plumbing in second floor bathroom, and updating of electrical system to code in the rectory; renovating the parish ministry center (PMC) by replacing worn carpeting, modernizing the PMC living room, and repainting and refreshing the PMC offices; enhancing the technology in our parish school; school air-conditioning additions and upgrading several textbook series used in the school. The total repairs amounted to \$182, 401 which was primarily funded by previous extraordinary income.

We were also beneficiaries of more than \$725,000 in bequests, and gifts which are not reflected in our ordinary operating results. Our savings at the Archdiocese of Chicago is nearly \$1.5 million. Overall we had a good year.

With the help of the Finance Council we are continuing to monitor our operating expenses in an effort to reverse the operating losses of the past several years. We cannot continue to rely on our extraordinary revenue to maintain our overall positive financial position.

On a very positive note we have no loans and no outstanding bills for fiscal year-end June 30, 2017. The enrollment numbers in our parish school and religious education program remain strong. The Teen Ministry is one of the most active in the area. And, as you will see in the report, the number of ministries that call St. Raymond their home and the good that they do for our parishioners and for those in need beyond our walls is simply amazing. Thank you for making this parish – YOUR parish -- one of the most vibrant parishes in the Northwest Suburbs!

Please know how much I appreciate your support these past several years.

Through Our Alms We Touch the World

Established in 1985, WINGS receives an average of 200 calls per month from women who are victims of domestic violence. It provides emergency safe shelter and transitional housing for women and children while they gain the help they need to move away from violence and towards safety and self-sufficiency. WINGS clients receive counseling, legal assistance, mentoring, life skills support and career services for a 2-year period while they become strong enough to function on their own. WINGS operates an emergency shelter in the northwest suburbs and another one on the southwest side of Chicago that can house 85 people each night. In addition, WINGS also has 47 transitional houses and apartments throughout the Chicago area. Dedicated staff and volunteers create a caring, respectful, and supportive family environment while the women are set them on a path to greater financial stability for themselves and their children.

One WINGS graduate shared: "I was able to get out of an extremely abusive relationship while in a state of financial fragility. WINGS allowed me to soar in a safe place where I could grow and develop as a person, as a parent and as a professional woman."

WINGS assists hundreds of people each year and depends on the financial support and commitment of the community to achieve its goals. WINGS needs volunteers in its three resale shops in Arlington Heights, Niles, and Schaumburg and donations of gently used clothing, housewares and furniture. Frequently asked questions:

What is Kairos?

Kairos, which means "God's time," is a 3-night, 4-day retreat experience for juniors and seniors in high school that enables them to spend time with peers, teen and adult leaders in order to get to know themselves, others, and God more deeply. Teens leave with a deeper understanding of themselves, their values, and their relationship to God.

Why go?

This is a good question. There are so many reasons that others who have been on Kairos might share with you about why you should go. Thousands of teens go on Kairos each year. They discover who they really are and how they want to live. They gain a better sense of themselves, what is important to them, and their relationship with God. Kairos is an experience of a lifetime. Many teens who attend say it was life-changing for them, or at the very least, a powerful and positive experience. Participants often leave with new and/or deeper friendships. Talk to past Kairos participants to learn more.

Who leads the retreat?

Each specific Kairos has a teen leadership team comprised of seniors who have previously attended a Kairos retreat. Leader application and selection began last year in April for this year's retreat. The team completes over 20 hours of training and team building. Adult volunteers from the parish also attend as retreat facilitators. The power of the retreat is that it is student-led, but adult-guided.

Where is it?

Kairos #3 will be held at Cabrini Retreat Center in Des Plaines. Teens gather at St. Raymond on Friday afternoon, take a bus to retreat center, and return to St. Raymond on Monday afternoon. We will leave on Friday, January 12th around 3:30 p.m. and return in the afternoon (around 3:30 p.m.) on Monday, January 15th. Students will NOT have to miss school on Monday because it is the Martin Luther King Jr Holiday.

How much does it cost?

The cost for the 4 day/3 night retreat is \$300. This includes all meals, lodging, supplies, and transportation. However, finances and cost should not deter any teen from attending. 



The Dream Act of 2017, S. 1615, was recently introduced in the Senate. If passed into law, this bipartisan bill would protect immigrant youth, including DACA beneficiaries. Similarly, Temporary Protected Status (TPS) allows individuals to remain and work lawfully in the U.S. during a period in which is deemed unsafe for nationals of that country to return home due to natural disaster, armed conflict, or other extraordinary conditions. This fall, the Administration will have to make decisions whether to extend TPS.

ACTION: Respond to the call of Pope Francis by asking your legislators to co-sponsor the Dream Act of 2017 and extend the TPS program. Visit the USCCB website: www.JusticeforImmigrants.org.




PADS Shelter Program
