St. Raymond's and St. Mark Lutheran's PADS SHELTER PROGRAM

Since 1990 St. Raymond's parish and St. Mark Lutheran church have partnered in providing hospitality, food and overnight emergency shelter to the homeless between October 1st and April 30th, every Monday evening through Tuesday morning (including holidays). The site is physically located at St. Mark's and is staffed entirely by volunteers from St. Raymond's and St. Mark's who prepare, supervise and clean sleeping accommodations as well as prepare and serve dinner, breakfast and a sack lunch.

This season at PADS there has been a rise in the number of guests coming to the St. Raymond's/St. Mark's PADS site. The Alms collected will be used directly by the PADS Shelter that St. Raymond's and St. Mark's host. The Alms will be used to replenish the pantry and provide the many "extra" items needed every week for the meals provided.

Please make any cash donations payable to St. Mark PADS. If you are able to provide any of the "extra" items, the following is a list of the items needed every week: milk, juices, fresh fruit, lunch meat, cheese, bread, snack size chips and granola bars. 



New Catholic School Scholarship Opportunity for 2018/19 School Year

Through the "Invest in Kids Act," the state of Illinois has created a new way to fund scholarships for children from low-income households who want to attend private schools. This program provides an opportunity for more students to receive a quality Catholic education. The tax credit scholarships offered through this program could cover **up to 100 percent of tuition and fees** for eligible, low-income students. Not all families will be eligible for the new scholarships, but we want to make sure all families are aware of the program.



Auditions for the 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th Grade Students of Saint Raymond Parish (Day School & Religious Education) will be held in the Community Room on Saturday, February 17th (10 AM until noon), and on Sunday, February 18th (1:30 until 3:00 PM) in the PLC. Once you turn in your form you will be contacted with your scheduled audition day and time. All who audition will be cast in the show. Audition forms should be returned to the school office or the PMC marked "Spring Musical" by February 15th.

If you would like to try out for a solo singing part (a major or featured role), please come prepared with a show tune ready to perform in the character that you would like to portray. There will be select songs from the show (both music and lyrics) available from the school office or the PMC. It is recommended that you prepare a show tune so you can demonstrate your acting ability by singing your song in character. You do not have to sing at the audition in order to be in the show. Everyone who auditions will do one or two readings from the show. It is strongly advised that you learn as much as you can about the characters.

Grades 2 through 4

Students in the 2nd, 3rd and 4th grade will be cast in the ensemble. There are no auditions for those grades. However, 2nd through 4th graders interested in being in the show need to fill out a sign-up sheet and return it to the school office or the PMC marked "Spring Musical" by February 15th.

Rehearsals and Performances

Mary Poppins Jr will be performed Thursday, May 24th, Friday, May 25th, Saturday, May 26th and Sunday, May 27th, in the PLC (Memorial Day Weekend). Rehearsals for grades 5 through 8 will usually be after school on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays beginning February 27th from 3:30 until 5 PM in the PLC. Rehearsals for grades 2 through 4 will usually be on Fridays. However, the first rehearsal is scheduled for Thursday, March 1st, from 4 until 5 PM in the Community Room.


