Through Our Alms We Touch the World



Agape Hope Center is a community-based organization founded in 2003 by Olivier Chiraba and Margaret Kimaiyo in the Dagoretti Waithaka region of Nairobi. The project was founded as an initiative to assist orphans and vulnerable children (OVC's) in the community especially those affected by HIV/AIDS. The goal of Agape Center is to provide an environment in which the children may grow to their full potential and become responsible adults who can support themselves and their families, all the while promoting Christian values.


Today, Agape is home to more than 100 orphaned children and provides nutrition and educational support to more than 200 additional children.

The children are expected to fulfill basic responsibilities such as making their beds, washing their clothes, and preparing food. They attend spiritual services on Sundays. The directors attempt to provide fulfilling and stimulating activities such as dance, music, and games, and assist adolescents in launching their career or vocational interests and finding employment. At least one teacher resides in the orphanage and helps to prepare meals and teach games in addition to educating children in the classroom. Agape also accepts volunteers to help care for the children, who number approximately 100 on site and up to 500 on campus and in the community combined.

At present, Agape's school building houses classrooms for children through eighth grade. There is a great need for a secondary school on the premises due to the increasing numbers of adolescent students on campus and in the adjacent neighborhoods. The Alms collected last year by St. Raymond's provided a great start to funding this secondary school building. During Lent, we will collect for several weeks to continue work on this secondary school.

Agape Hope Center for Children operates through the kindness and generosity of donors. Serving Orphans Worldwide (SOW), based in the United States, has also dedicated its resources to help the youth of Agape (see also http://soworldwide.org/orphanage/agape-hope-childrens-home/). We are happy that you have chosen to be part of our community. You will find St. Raymond to be a place where you can grow in faith, share your talents in a variety of ministries and meet many friendly people. We are so glad to have you here!

We believe that when a family decides to become a member of St. Raymond they are making a conscious decision and commitment to join us for worship, service, fellowship and to make us their spiritual home. AWARENESS

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:
"I didn't know it was abuse.", "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.




