

Please feel free to come into the sanctuary in order to get a better look.




### Week 5 - Panel 5 - Oh! That which appears to be dead ... Isn't!

### MATS FOR THE HOMELESS MINISTRY

# Microfinancing Partners in Africa Cows Against Malaria Project



Cows Against Malaria Project began here in parishes of the Northwest Suburbs of Chicago, and expanded the existing programs of Microfinancing Partners in Africa, to fight the widespread disease of malaria, very common among the poor and rural people of Africa. Father John Bosco Ssekomo, a Ugandan priest who studied at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary, served as deacon at Our Lady of the Wayside, then returned to the Lugazi Diocese after his ordination, shared his concern about the widespread disease of malaria among the poor of his country. While medication for treatment is available, it is costly, and not available through the Ugandan government. Only the affluent have access to this medication.

Based in the Archdiocese of St. Louis, **MPA** provides grants that fund sustainable projects to promote the welfare of poor villagers in Uganda and other African nations. In operation since 2009 the MPA **Cow Project** loans a pregnant heifer to each family in a cohort of about 15, who each receive about 8 months of training, and ongoing direction to set up a zero-grazing dairy farm. Participating families prepare their land for the projects, and construct a shelter for their animal. Each family commits to giving back the first female calf born to their cow. Besides providing nourishment for the family, the sale of milk from the family's cow to a local dairy provides income for the family's needs. MPA finds that cost of livestock and training is about \$800 per family.

Those cohorts participating in their **Cows Against Malaria Project** sign an additional agreement to tithe back 10% of their milk proceeds to support a small clinic, that will provide malaria medication and basic healthcare services to mothers and children of the village. Local pastor, Fr. Peter Ssenkaayi recently reported that the first **CAMP** cohort in the Biikira Parish of the Masaka Diocese completed their eight months of training and preparation, and received the delivery of their cows in December 2017.

It is hoped that some of the hundreds of applicant families, already vetted for the project, and currently on wait lists, will be served by upcoming CAMP cohorts, soon to be formed. New cohorts and clinics will also be set up in the Diocese of Lugazi.

Our St. Raymond Lenten almsgiving for the weekends of March 10, 17, and 24, 2018 will go toward providing the training, direction, and animals needed for the next **Cows Against Malaria** cohorts planned for Masaka, Lugazi or in other neighboring dioceses of Uganda.




