Update---Bethany House of Hospitality for Young Immigrant Women

Since opening its doors in October, Bethany House of Hospitality for Young Immigrant Women in Bartlett has provided safety and shelter for an increasing number of residents needing its services. At this point, 17 young women, including the mother of a 7 month old baby boy and his 3 yr. old sister from Guatemala are in residence. Although sponsored by Sr. Val's community and the other women's religious communities in our area, additional assistance is always welcome. Immediate needs now include:

- Diapers for 16-20 lb. baby
- Pull-Ups for 3 yr. old girl
- Enfamil Premium for 0-12 month old baby
- Twin bed sheet sets
- Tissues

Dear St. Raymond Parishioners,

This fiscal year will come to a close in a few weeks. While we enjoy so many positive outcomes and blessings together as a parish community, we do struggle making it all come together. Our ability to share and use our resources, specifically of financial support, will always be a continual process. That is why I bring this request of support forward. I, along with the finance council, ask for you to support our Catch-up campaign until June 30, 2018.

Currently, we have a budgetary and actual deficit for the year. We are about \$30,000 behind to budget projection and quite significantly more overall. More of this financial picture will be shared in the autumn when we complete payments and all our accounting. I humbly ask that we try to raise \$100,000 in extra funds to cover a portion of our deficit.

It is not easy for me to come forward and ask for this extra funding, especially when I know firsthand the generosity of our parishioners. The gracious way we care for others, support our parish and the positive responses to our last campaign. I can only say thank you! As pastor, I try to foster a climate of good stewardship, collecting and using our resources responsibly. Unfortunately, this is not always easy venture in such a large parish with various components. I thank you for your understanding.

A note from the Finance Council:

The parishioners of St. Raymond de Penafort have always been responsive to the needs of the parish. Most recently this was seen by the incredible response to our capital campaign, Sharing our Faith - Securing our Future. As we near the end of our fiscal year (June 30, 2018), we must again ask for your support.

It is clear the parish will sustain a considerable financial deficit for the year ending June 30, 2018. Most of this deficit has resulted from our school operation. We have had higher than expected investments in our teachers, textbooks, teaching equipment and school maintenance. In addition to tuition, the school has always been supported by the general parish revenues. However, this year our regular Sunday collections, as well as Christmas and Easter collections, have been less than budget.

While only a short time remains before the end of our fiscal year, we ask that everyone consider increasing their regular donations in the next few weeks to help improve our financial position. Rest assured we are closely monitoring our financial position and have established a balanced budget for next year.

Al Huson is located about 12 miles from the border with Syria; in recent years, the arrival of many refugees has heavily impacted the economy and daily life in the city. With help from university students in the parish who teach math, Arabic, and English, hundreds of children not in the school system are learning to read and write.³

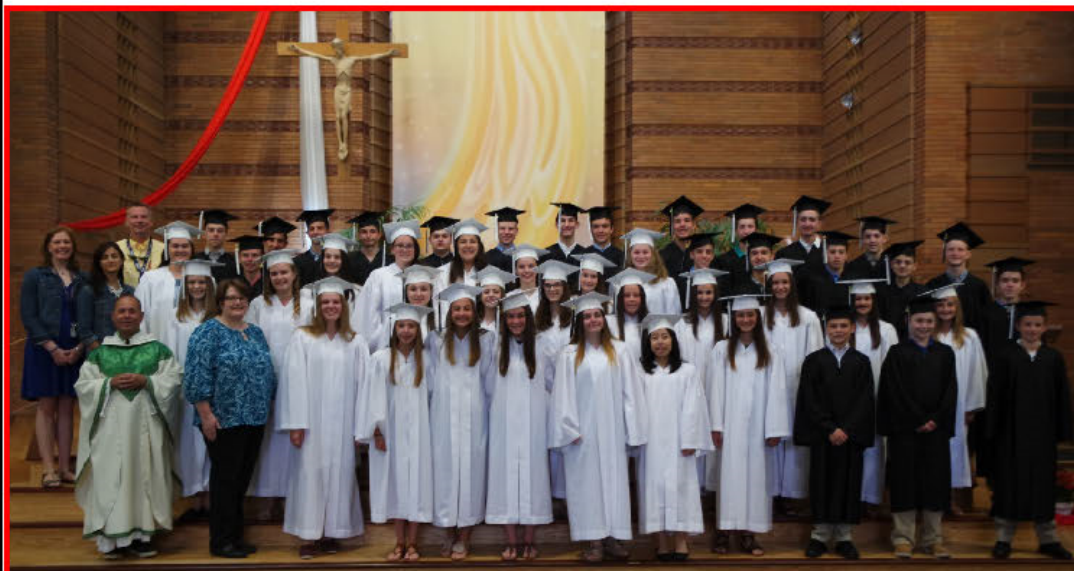

LUTHERAN CHURCH OF THE CROSS FOOD PANTRY

The Lutheran Church of the Cross houses the largest private charitable food pantry serving five towns in the northwest suburbs, including Mount Prospect. It is located in Arlington Heights next to the former Forest View High School, now the District 214 Headquarters. The LCC food pantry is an agency of the Greater Chicago Food Depository. This affiliation enables the food pantry to purchase \$8.00 worth of staples for every \$1.00 donated.



The food pantry serves an average of 100 families per week. Every family receives a twenty pound bag of staples, along with a box of meat, bakery, grocery and dairy products provided by local grocery stores. It distributes food every Tuesday from 9 am until 1 pm.

All pantry workers are volunteers, there is no paid staff. They are Catholic, Protestant, Mormon and neighbors without religious affiliation. They unload, sort, pack and distribute food every week.



LUTHERAN CHURCH OF THE CROSS FOOD PANTRY

St. Raymond Parish collected \$2,094 for Lutheran Church of the Cross Food Pantry . The LCC food pantry supplies St. Raymond parish with a substantial amount of food weekly and also supplies food to the Viatorian House of Hospitality, home to twenty young male refugees. The LCC food pantry is completely dependent on volunteers. Presently, seven St. Raymond parishioners volunteer there each Tuesday. Cash donations are preferred, but food donations are also appreciated.

As a member Agency of the Greater Chicago Food Depository (GCFD) since 2007 the pantry serviced an average of 40 families weekly and distributed 2,000 bags of groceries - in 2017 the average was 100 recipients weekly which translates to serving over 5,000 recipients helping to feed approximately 15,000 family members that year!

The LCC pantry clients are a diverse population of various nationalities.



As a result of an extraordinary donation of 18 tons of food by the Arlington Heights Post Office annual food drive, combined with the 80 tons of food donated and purchased from the Greater Chicago Food Depository, the LCC food pantry distributed over 100 tons of food this year.

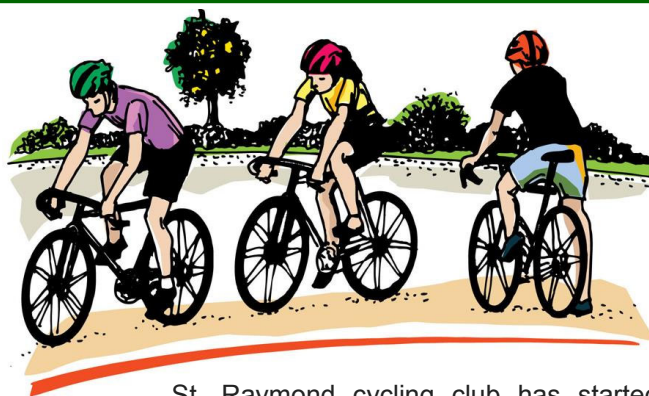
Have you registered for the annual Golden Wedding Anniversary Mass?

St. Raymond Altar Sever Ministry



The Faith Community of St. Raymond has been blessed with a long and rich history of enjoying a very active Altar Server Ministry. That tradition continues today. We currently have 54 high school servers who minister at the weekend masses and at weddings, and 78 morning mass and funeral altar servers who attend the various grade schools, starting in 5th grade. Any St. Raymond young person is invited to join the Altar Server Ministry at any time. Most of our altar servers dedicate eight years to the ministry and to the people of St. Raymond!

We are in the process of recruiting our current 4th grade students (along with any older students). Our new prospective servers attend a training session in church. They will then spend their summer hiatus attending or "shadowing" three morning masses, where they are united, one on one, with an experienced server and learn how to minister at mass. We thank the adult morning sacristans as they assist and mentor our new servers during this training period.

We can be proud of the many wonderful young people who generously minister at the Lord's Table. May God bless them all!

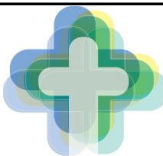
Migrant families who are escaping various forms of violence and persecution in their homeland are being routinely separated at the border. Since October 2017, over 700 children have been separated from their parents, including over 100 children under the age of four. On May 4, 2018, DHS stated that it will refer all individuals who cross the border without authorization for criminal prosecution, including adult members of family units. If implemented, this policy will undoubtedly lead to a drastic increase in incidences of family separation.
