# An Invitation to Reclaim the Good News of Jesus

On Pentecost Sunday, a statement of beliefs to Reclaim the Good News of Jesus at this time in the history of our nation was published in the bulletin and affirmed by members of our parish staff and council.

That Statement of Beliefs is now posted in the narthex. As the faith community of St. Raymond, you also are invited to affirm these beliefs by signing the book so that together we might find a common voice to speak to the challenges of our time.

- 1.** WE BELIEVE each human being is made in God's image and likeness. (Genesis 1:26)  
THEREFORE WE SHALL treat all people with respect from conception until natural death.
- 2.** WE BELIEVE we are one body. (Galatians 3:28)  
THEREFORE WE SHALL welcome, protect and bless all races, genders, classes, orientations and faiths.
- 3.** WE BELIEVE how we treat the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the stranger, the sick and the prisoner is how we treat Christ himself. (Matthew 25: 31-46)  
THEREFORE WE SHALL uphold and care for the vulnerable in our midst, drawing people close through Christian hospitality.
- 4.** WE BELIEVE that truth is morally central to our personal and public lives. (John 14:6)  
THEREFORE WE SHALL uphold truth-telling in our culture, beginning with our children and families.
- 5.** WE BELIEVE that Christ's way of leadership is servanthood, not domination. (Matthew 20:25-26)  
THEREFORE WE SHALL support democracy not because we believe in human perfection, but because we do not.
- 6.** WE BELIEVE Jesus when he tells us to go into all nations making disciples. (Matthew 28:18-19)  
THEREFORE WE SHALL live in awareness of the needs of the global community.
- 7.** WE BELIEVE the Eucharist is the body and blood of Christ and that we are called to be nurtured each week at the table of the Lord. (John 6:48-51)  
THEREFORE WE SHALL honor the Sabbath as a day to rest with our family in our Lord.

Good news! Pardon the inconvenience.

Happy summer! After this past campaign, our parish had some specific goals to renew various aspects of our campus. I am delighted to announce the beginning of one such project. The Church parking lot. Starting this coming week, on July 17 through the next 2 weeks, the parking lot will be milled, some sections repaired and completely resurfaced and striped. Accordingly, new lighting will follow and it is my hope all will be in place by mid- August. During this time the parking lot can be used only in designated areas. We are working with the vendor to designate areas in rotation so that on weekends some parking will be available. Please do not park in the lot on weekdays. No striping will be apparent until the final stage. Prior to this, all of the sewers were thoroughly cleaned and they are in great shape except one that needs minor repairs. Please be patient with this ongoing enterprise. The total cost for this project is roughly \$300,000.

Another project that we hope to complete fully or partially is adding cooling units in the school. More information will be forth coming.

Last, I would like to thank the capital campaign implementation committee and its members for their continued support, determination and work in making these projects come together. This is all possible because of the offerings and contributions to the campaign. Please remember to continue to fulfill your pledges and donations. With the committee and myself, we thank you, for your generous sharing. If you have not received or started to fulfill your pledge please consider doing so that our funds will last to complete all these projects.

- Support Pastoral, Youth, Young Adult, Campus and Outreach Ministries, Catholic Schools and Religious Education Programs.





## St. Raymond Altar Server Ministry

The Faith Community of St. Raymond has been blessed with a long and rich history of enjoying a very active Altar Server Ministry. That tradition continues today. We currently have 54 high school servers who minister at the weekend masses and at weddings, and 78 morning mass and funeral altar servers who attend the various grade schools, starting in 5th grade. Any St. Raymond young person is invited to join the Altar Server Ministry at any time. Most of our altar servers dedicate eight years to the ministry and to the people of St. Raymond!

We are in the process of recruiting our current 4th grade students (along with any older students). Our new prospective servers attend a training session in church. They will then spend their summer hiatus attending or “shadowing” three morning masses, where they are united, one on one, with an experienced server and learn how to minister at mass. We thank the adult morning sacristans as they assist and mentor our new servers during this training period.

We can be proud of the many wonderful young people who generously minister at the Lord's Table. May God bless them all!


**Have you registered for the annual Golden Wedding Anniversary Mass?**

Migrant families who are escaping various forms of violence and persecution in their homeland are being routinely separated at the boarder. Since October 2017, over 700 children have been separated from their parents, including over 100 children under the age of four. On May 4, 2018, DHS stated that it will refer all individuals who cross the border without authorization for criminal prosecution, including adult members of family units. If implemented, this policy will undoubtedly lead to a drastic increase in incidences of family separation.
