## **Through Our Alms We Touch the World** **Missionary Cooperation Plan**

All baptized Catholics have a responsibility to respond to the missionary needs of the worldwide Church. Each year, parishes in the Archdiocese of Chicago are assigned a mission cause to participate in the summer Missionary Cooperation Plan (MCP) appeal.

MCP donations are used to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ through primary evangelization, as well as to promote and support vocations, faith formation and catechesis, to build churches, seminaries and schools. Missionaries also use funds in direct-service projects such as the building of clinics, hospitals, orphanages, and women's shelters. This "mission cooperation" of bringing together missionaries and local communities helps to deepen our understanding of our baptismal duty to evangelize the world and bring people to Christ

Fr. Ramon Uriarte from The Diocese of Gumaca, located in the Philippines, is preaching the mission appeal. The proceeds of the appeal will go to the Diocesan Evangelization Fund, which is in charge of organizing and forming Basic Ecclesial Communities and training of lay leaders, to the on-going formation, and in some cases the hospitalization, of priests and to several pastoral programs.

Fr. Ramon Uriarte has been a priest for 33 years. He is currently School Superintendent and Vicar General of the Diocese of Gumaca. Fr. Ramon Uriarte will be visiting St. Raymond Parish the weekend of August 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> as part of this appeal.



## St. Raymond Altar Server Ministry



The Faith Community of St. Raymond has been blessed with a long and rich history of enjoying a very active Altar Server Ministry. That tradition continues today. We currently have 54 high school servers who minister at the weekend masses and at weddings, and 78 morning mass and funeral altar servers who attend the various grade schools, starting in 5th grade. Any St. Raymond young person is invited to join the Altar Server Ministry at any time. Most of our altar servers dedicate eight years to the ministry and to the people of St. Raymond!

We are in the process of recruiting our current 4th grade students (along with any older students). Our new prospective servers attend a training session in church. They will then spend their summer hiatus attending or "shadowing" three morning masses, where they are united, one on one, with an experienced server and learn how to minister at mass. We thank the adult morning sacristans as they assist and mentor our new servers during this training period.

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

One of the great **gifts** we've been given is the **opportunity** to **BE church together!** At St. Raymond's we do that in so many ways: through our liturgies, formation and education programs, outreach programs and our socializing and hospitality. We continually strive to create an atmosphere where **God's active presence** will be **discovered among us.**

And so we always try to **welcome new members** – especially those who might be searching for something more. Sometimes all that is needed is a **gentle invitation** -- a little encouragement from someone to do something that we've been thinking about for a long time -- a little encouragement to stop putting something off -- and recognize that perhaps now is the time to take action.

And so we encourage you, our parishioners, to prayerfully consider people you know -- a spouse, friend, relative, co-worker, or neighbor -- and invite them to explore our faith.

The **RCIA** (**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**) is designed for men and women who have never been baptized or who were baptized in another Christian denomination and are considering becoming Catholic. It is also appropriate for baptized Catholics who have received little formal religious education or who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation.

The RCIA is a wonderful process, involving some of our own parishioners who accompany the candidates on their faith journey. Our **regular meetings** are on Monday evenings.

## ST. RAYMOND PARISH DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OUTREACH

### AWARENESS-SERVICES-PREVENTION

#### AWARENESS

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse.", "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."


