

An Invitation to Reclaim the Good News of Jesus

On Pentecost Sunday, a statement of beliefs to Reclaim the Good News of Jesus at this time in the history of our nation was published in the bulletin and affirmed by members of our parish staff and council.

That Statement of Beliefs is now posted in the narthex. As the faith community of St. Raymond, you also are invited to affirm these beliefs by signing the book so that together we might find a common voice to speak to the challenges of our time.

- 1. WE BELIEVE each human being is made in God's image and likeness. (Genesis 1:26)
 THEREFORE WE SHALL treat all people with respect from conception until natural death.
- WE BELIEVE we are one body. (Galatians 3:28)
 THEREFORE WE SHALL welcome, protect and bless all races, genders, classes, orientations and faiths.
- 3. WE BELIEVE how we treat the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the stranger, the sick and the prisoner is how we treat Christ himself. (Matthew 25: 31-46)
 THEREFORE WE SHALL uphold and care for the vulnerable in our midst, drawing people close through Christian hospitality.
- **4.** WE BELIEVE that truth is morally central to our personal and public lives. (John 14:6) THEREFORE WE SHALL uphold truth-telling in our culture, beginning with our children and families.
- **5.** WE BELIEVE that Christ's way of leadership is servanthood, not domination. (Matthew 20:25-26) THEREFORE WE SHALL support democracy not because we believe in human perfection, but because we do not.
- **6.** WE BELIEVE Jesus when he tells us to go into all nations making disciples. (Matthew 28:18-19) THEREFORE WE SHALL live in awareness of the needs of the global community.
- 7. WE BELIEVE the Eucharist is the body and blood of Christ and that we are called to be nurtured each week at the table of the Lord. (John 6:48-51)

 THEREFORE WE SHALL honor the Sabbath as a day to rest with our family in our Lord.

Founded in 1996, this ministry has grown to over 20 male and female members of all ages, who have lovingly hand made and distributed over 230,000 rosaries free of charge to local ministries and mission fields worldwide. These "Gospels on a string" have been shipped all across America, as well as to the following 28 countries overseas: Belize,

Brazil, China, Ecuador, Germany, Haiti, Honduras, India, Ireland, Italy, Ivory Coast, Jamaica, Kenya, Latvia, Mexico, Namibia, New Guinea, Nicaragua, Nigeria, Pakistan, The Philippines, Puerto Rico Solomon Islands, Switzerland, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, and Vietnam.

Through Our Alms We Touch the World Emmaus Ministries



In 1985 when John Green was a freshman at Wheaton College volunteering to help female prostitutes in Chicago, the director of that organization pointed to a cluster of men on a street corner, and said the words that gave birth to Emmaus Ministries, "Those guys over there are prostituting, too. But nobody works with them; nobody cares about male prostitutes." John took this as a call by God to develop a ministry to help men in prostitution, to show the members of this marginalized community that they are loved—by God and by God's people. In 1990 Emmaus Ministries began its outreach and support network to men involved in street prostitution in Chicago.

Today Emmaus Ministries is committed to helping men who are involved in survival prostitution to leave the streets and enter into a life of faith in Jesus Christ. These men are at great physical and spiritual risk. Many will die too young from disease, substance abuse, or the hardships and violence of street life. This is why Emmaus Ministries Outreach teams—staff and volunteers—walk the streets every day, building relationships of trust and respect with men in prostitution. As these friendships grow, the Outreach teams begin helping men take the steps necessary to get off the streets.

Whether it's offering prayer and support over a cup of coffee, providing transportation to get out of the cold, or referring an individual to a treatment center, Emmaus Ministries is available to men who are among the most overlooked and under-served on the streets. The Emmaus Ministries has a Ministry Center which is a place of hospitality, prayer, discipleship, and recovery. The Ministry Center is a refuge and a place of new beginnings for the men staff and volunteers meet on the streets.

The Ministry Center provides meals, clothing, and fellowship. In a typical year we serve 150 to 300 men, for a total of over 3,000 meals. The Ministry Center is also a safe environment away from the temptations and mentality of the streets. The staff and volunteers become, for many of the men, a surrogate family that provides love and support, but also firm and dependable boundaries. For individuals who have been abused and neglected for much of their lives, these trustworthy relationships can be key to their healing. The Ministry Center is a place where men receive support in finding new life away from the streets.

Emmaus Ministries provides many services, from tutoring the men in reading and budgeting to helping them obtain legal identification to coaching them through the responsibilities that come with having an apartment.

Amid all the activity, the men of Emmaus receive spiritual support and encouragement through informal conversations around the table or while hanging out in the Ministry Center. Emmaus Ministries relationships extend far beyond the Ministry Center; whether men become incarcerated, return to the streets, or are hospitalized, Emmaus Ministries corresponds with and visits them, remaining a consistent presence in their lives. 
A listening session where participants are invited to share a two-minute response to any of the following questions:

The purpose of this ministry is to provide sleeping mats to homeless persons on lower Wacker Drive. Clean, plastic grocery bags are cut, knotted into plarn" (plastic yarn) and crocheted into mats.

We need people to: 1) sort and flatten the plastic bags; 2) cut the plastic into strips; 3) knot the strips and roll into balls of plarn; 4) crochet the mats.



Will My Dog Go To Heaven?

All women are invited to join us for St. Raymond's Gathering of Women on Saturday morning, **October 27, 2018** for Mass, breakfast, good company and our own Sister Dee as the speaker. We begin with **Mass at 8:00 AM** and **end at 11:00 AM**.

"Will my dog go to heaven?" When Pope Francis was asked this question by a child, the Pope responded "yes!" This is not a frivolous question. The answer that each one of us would give to that question is grounded in how we understand the very nature of our God. It

also reflects our understanding of God's compassion. How inclusive is God's love? How inclusive is God's saving grace? And what might it mean to **'be saved?'** Many of us learned that God the Father sent Jesus to die on the cross in order to "open the gates of heaven" and "save us from our sins." But there are other perspectives in the Gospels. There are other ways of thinking about this – in light of all we know about the expansiveness and creativity of the universe and what Scripture reveals to us about God's own expansive, creative, inclusive, compassionate love. Does God's gracious, salvific love include all of **God's beloved creation?** And what difference does that make in **our own lives?**

Worry, fear and anger destroy both relationships and the family unit. The Substance Abuse Team is available to reach out with support and care. 

Migrant families who are escaping various forms of violence and persecution in their homeland are being routinely separated at the boarder. Since October 2017, over 700 children have been separated from their parents, including over 100 children under the age of four. On May 4, 2018, DHS stated that it will refer all individuals who cross the border without authorization for criminal prosecution, including adult members of family units. If implemented, this policy will undoubtedly lead to a drastic increase in incidences of family separation.




