We live in a time where our values and the core message of the gospel of Jesus through our faith tradition is subject to ridicule, stands unknown, and in some cases is trivialized as not relevant. This is our way of voicing the importance of Jesus and the message he offers his disciples to speak to our day and age. Sr. Val Kulbacki and Fr. Corey Brost spoke to points 1 and 3 in the past. We will continue to share the importance of these declarations for the next few months.

During the weekend celebrations of October 27-28, Fr. Ed Panek will be the homilist for all masses. As a parish we will address declaration number 2 on our list of statements. We believe we are one body. (Galatians 3:28) *Therefore we shall welcome, protect and bless all races, genders, classes, orientations and faiths.*

An Invitation to Reclaim the Good News of Jesus

On Pentecost Sunday, a statement of beliefs to Reclaim the Good News of Jesus at this time in the history of our nation was published in the bulletin and affirmed by members of our parish staff and council.

That Statement of Beliefs is now posted in the narthex. As the faith community of St. Raymond, you also are invited to affirm these beliefs by signing the book so that together we might find a common voice to speak to the challenges of our time.

1. WE BELIEVE each human being is made in God's image and likeness. (Genesis 1:26)
THEREFORE WE SHALL treat all people with respect from conception until natural death.
2. WE BELIEVE we are one body. (Galatians 3:28)
THEREFORE WE SHALL welcome, protect and bless all races, genders, classes, orientations and faiths.
3. WE BELIEVE how we treat the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the stranger, the sick and the prisoner is how we treat Christ himself. (Matthew 25: 31-46)
THEREFORE WE SHALL uphold and care for the vulnerable in our midst, drawing people close through Christian hospitality.
4. WE BELIEVE that truth is morally central to our personal and public lives. (John 14:6)
THEREFORE WE SHALL uphold truth-telling in our culture, beginning with our children and families.
5. WE BELIEVE that Christ's way of leadership is servanthood, not domination. (Matthew 20:25-26)
THEREFORE WE SHALL support democracy not because we believe in human perfection, but because we do not.
6. WE BELIEVE Jesus when he tells us to go into all nations making disciples. (Matthew 28:18-19)
THEREFORE WE SHALL live in awareness of the needs of the global community.
7. WE BELIEVE the Eucharist is the body and blood of Christ and that we are called to be nurtured each week at the table of the Lord. (John 6:48-51)
THEREFORE WE SHALL honor the Sabbath as a day to rest with our family in our Lord.

Through Our Alms We Touch the World

WATTS OF LOVE

While accompanying her husband on a business trip to the Philippines, Nancy Economou volunteered to help serve at a local feeding program. There she met a young girl severely burned and scarred by a kerosene lamp – the only source of light for so many in the developing world. As she looked around, she witnessed not only burns and injuries from kerosene lamps, but also children left unattended in complete darkness while their parents worked at night. Nancy could not imagine her own five sons living in such extreme conditions. For many, living in a world of darkness means relying on toxic fuels like kerosene for lighting, if a family can afford to buy it. Unfortunately, kerosene is one of the only options available and is very expensive, volatile and deadly. Toxic soot attacks the upper respiratory system and causes chronic coughs and lung disease. All too often, this highly flammable fuel is responsible for causing horrific disfigurements that few can afford to treat with medical attention. At that moment she committed herself to developing safe, sustainable lighting sources for those living without basic access to electricity. WATTS OF LOVE founders began their epic journey to design, manufacture and deliver 1,000 solar lights to one of the poorest islands in the Philippines. WATTS of LOVE found that these solar lights enabled success enjoyed by students, seamstresses, midwives and fishermen who marveled at the new opportunities their solar tools had provided. Aside from enabling with up to 130 continuous hours of reliable light, the Watts of Love lanterns feature charging capabilities to charge small electronic devices.

Each light costs \$50. The alms collected will be used to purchase the WATTS of LOVE solar lights for Father Gilbert to hand deliver to his home village and the surrounding area in Tanzania. He has personally seen the difference these lights have on the families who receive them.

Remembering Our Loved Ones in November




During the month of November, we remember our deceased loved ones in a special way. Beginning the **weekend of October 27/28** the parish's Book of the Remembrance will be displayed near the Holy Family Shrine for all to enroll the names of deceased family members and friends. Please enroll their names every year.

Also at that time, **everyone** is invited to bring a photograph (preferably framed) of your loved one(s) to mass. Before mass begins, please place the photograph in the Remembrance Space which will be located near the Holy Family Shrine. Be sure to mark your name and telephone number or email address on the back of the photograph. The Remembrance Space will be displayed through Thanksgiving, on Thursday, November 22th. Please plan to leave your photograph on display for the entire time.

Thursday, November 1st is the Solemnity of All Saints—mass will be celebrated at 8:15 a.m., and 7:00 p.m. Friday, November 2nd is the Commemoration of All Souls—mass will be celebrated at 8:15 a.m.

The Mass of Remembrance will be celebrated on Monday, November 5th at 7:00 pm. All the faithfully departed will be remembered at this mass, however, in a special way, we will especially remember those who have died in this past year. If you would like the name of a loved one, who died this past year and whose funeral was not celebrated here at St Raymond included, please call Sister Val at the Parish Ministry Office. In 1531, when the indigenous people of Mexico were subjugated and the practice of human sacrifice was a recent memory, the Mother of God appeared to St. Juan Diego as a pregnant native woman, now known as our Lady of Guadalupe.

She sent him with miraculous flowers in his cloak to tell the bishop to build a church where people could receive her Son and her loving, tender care. When St. Juan Diego opened his cloak before the bishop, an image of our Lady was revealed that remains to this day.



INSTITUTE FOR DIACONAL STUDIES

JOHNNY BURNETT TO BE INSTITUTED INTO THE MINISTRY OF ACOLYTE

Please continue your prayers for deacon candidate (insert name of candidate) as the Most Rev. Joseph N. Perry will preside at his institution into the Ministry of Acolyte on 4 November 18 at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, University of Saint Mary of the Lake in Mundelein. Johnny is one of 24 candidates to be instituted into this ministry.

As is noted in the words of the Rite, instituted acolytes “have a special role in the Church’s ministry.” The Rite notes the following responsibilities:

- Assist priests and deacons in carrying out their ministry at the Eucharist;
- As special ministers, they are to give Holy Communion to the faithful at the liturgy, and to the sick;
- Because they are specially called to this ministry, they should strive to live more fully by the Lord’s sacrifice and to be molded more perfectly in its likeness;
- They should seek to understand the deep spiritual meaning of what they do so to offer themselves daily to God as spiritual sacrifices acceptable to Him through Jesus Christ.

Regarding the Ministry of Acolyte, Canon Law also notes that newly instituted acolytes must regularly exercise their ministry from this point forward if they are to be considered for the possibility of Holy Orders.

This year, Johnny Burnett continues to be involved in multi-dimensional study, prayer and preparation for possible Holy Orders. Academic and formation courses include Sacramental Theology, Christology, Soteriology, Homiletics, Christian Anthropology, Spiritual Theology, Presiding at the Rites, Moral Theology; a retreat for candidates and wives; monthly meetings for theological reflection; monthly Spiritual Direction; and a retreat prior to his institution to the Ministry of Acolyte. He also has been involved in a series of field education and internship experiences. Thus, he continues his four-year preparation as a candidate for the diaconate.

Presently, there are nearly 580 active deacons in the Archdiocese of Chicago, and 75 men (accompanied by their wives, if married) currently participate in the Institute for Diaconal Studies.

Please keep Johnny Burnett, his wife Susan, and all those in formation and their families, in your prayers that they might continue to answer God’s call in their lives. Family, friends and parishioners are invited to attend the liturgy/institution. There will be a light reception at USML’s Conference Center following the Mass.



WOMEN’S SPIRITUALITY CIRCLES

Women’s Spirituality Circles are small groups of women who gather once a month to nourish, reflect upon and share their own spiritual lives. A resource book is used, which enables the women to come to a deeper understanding of themselves and their own unique spirituality. Through reading, discussion and prayerful reflection, the women experience a deeper prayer life and the invitation to share their gifts in service to God’s people. They gather strength, insight and a sense of gratitude from one another. Each group has a facilitator. MAC (MEN OF ACTION AND CONTEMPLATION)

MAC is a group of five or six men who commit themselves to meeting twice a month for one hour to dialogue, support and encourage each other to live the Gospel message more fully in their daily lives. A resource book, based on the daily scripture readings is used. Each daily reflection contains a part of a scripture reading, a contemporary story, a question for one’s own life application and a concluding thought for the day. Each man is asked to find ten minutes each day to reflect and pray over the daily reflection. The men involved find that this experience helps them in their daily lives. And what might it mean to **"be saved?"** Many of us learned that God the Father sent Jesus to die on the cross in order to "open the gates of heaven" and "save us from our sins." There are other ways of thinking about this – in light of all we know about the expansiveness and creativity of the universe and what Scripture reveals to us about God's own expansive, creative, inclusive, compassionate love. Does God's gracious, salvific love include all of **God's beloved creation?** And what difference does that make in **our own lives?**


