THROUGH OUR ALMS WE TOUCH THE WORLD

St. Raymond's and St. Mark Lutheran's PADS SHELTER PROGRAM

Since 1990 St. Raymond's parish and St. Mark Lutheran church have partnered in providing hospitality, food and overnight shelter through a PADS site to the homeless between October 1 and April 30, every Monday evening through Tuesday morning (including holidays). The site is physically located at St. Mark's and is staffed entirely by volunteers from St. Raymond's and St. Mark's who prepare, supervise and clean sleeping accommodations as well as prepare and serve dinner, breakfast and a sack lunch.

There has been a rise in the number of guests coming to the St. Raymond's/St. Mark's PADS site. The Alms collected will be used to directly by the PADS Shelter that St. Raymond's and St. Mark's host. The Alms will be used to replenish the pantry and provide the many "extra" items needed every week for the meals provided.

This year we also need volunteers on Monday to set up, be on site, prepare and serve food and cleanup on Tuesday morning. In particular we need volunteers for the following areas:

- Staff the site for al shifts, 6:30 -11:00pm, 11:00pm 3:00 am and 3:00 am 7:00am
- (In particular Women to staff the 3:00 am 7:00 am shift on the 2nd & 3rd Mondays)
- Donate and/or prepare and serve food
- Clean-up on Tuesday morning: 6:00 am 7:15 am

That Statement of Beliefs is now posted in the narthex. As the faith community of St. Raymond, you also are invited to affirm these beliefs by signing the book so that together we might find a common voice to speak to the challenges of our time.

- 1. WE BELIEVE each human being is made in God's image and likeness. (Genesis 1:26)
 THEREFORE WE SHALL treat all people with respect from conception until natural death.
- 2. WE BELIEVE we are one body. (Galatians 3:28)
 THEREFORE WE SHALL welcome, protect and bless all races, genders, classes, orientations and faiths.
- 3. WE BELIEVE how we treat the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the stranger, the sick and the prisoner is how we treat Christ himself. (Matthew 25: 31-46)
 THEREFORE WE SHALL uphold and care for the vulnerable in our midst, drawing people close through Christian hospitality.
- 4. WE BELIEVE that truth is morally central to our personal and public lives. (John 14:6)

 THEREFORE WE SHALL uphold truth-telling in our culture, beginning with our children and families.
- 5. WE BELIEVE that Christ's way of leadership is servanthood, not domination. (Matthew 20:25-26)
 THEREFORE WE SHALL support democracy not because we believe in human perfection, but because we do not.
- 6. WE BELIEVE Jesus when he tells us to go into all nations making disciples. (Matthew 28:18-19) THEREFORE WE SHALL live in awareness of the needs of the global community.
- 7. WE BELIEVE the Eucharist is the body and blood of Christ and that we are called to be nurtured each week at the table of the Lord. (John 6:48-51)

 THEREFORE WE SHALL honor the Sabbath as a day to rest with our family in our Lord.

Religious Education PROGRAM



At our Students in Action (SIA) Mass on October 21, our 3rd graders mentioned that they would be learning more about the Saints. All of the RE 1st through 6th graders gathered in the Community Room and in the gym to do some fun activities designed to help them learn about the lives of Saints, and to connect to the people these Saints are patrons to. At St. Michael the Archangel's station, students wrote letters and drew pictures for veterans, and brought home a green army figure to help remind them to pray for the men and women who protect our country. At St. Patrick's station, students had a chance to play "Pin the Shamrock on St. Patrick," and to listen to a story about the patron Saint of Ireland -- who wasn't even Irish! At St. Catherine's station, students left a painted thumbprint on a canvas as they learned about this patron Saint of artists. At St. Sebastian's station, students had a blast running relay races and learning about the patron Saint of athletes, who lived in the early days of the Church. At St. Kateri's station, students learned about our first Native American Saint, who lived in New York and serves as a patron Saint of the ecology. We had help at both sessions from many 7th and 8th graders who came to RE on their day off of class to guide the younger students at each of the stations.



JOHNNY BURNETT TO BE INSTITUTED INTO THE MINISTRY OF ACOLYTE

Please continue your prayers for deacon candidate Johnny Burnett as the Most Rev. Joseph N. Perry will preside at his institution into the Ministry of Acolyte on November 4, 2018 at 1:30 pm at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, University of Saint Mary of the Lake in Mundelein. Johnny is one of 24 candidates to be instituted into this ministry.

As is noted in the words of the Rite, instituted acolytes "have a special role in the Church's ministry." The Rite notes the following responsibilities:

- Assist priests and deacons in carrying out their ministry at the Eucharist;
- As special ministers, they are to give Holy Communion to the faithful at the liturgy, and to the sick;
- Because they are specially called to this ministry, they should strive to live more fully by the Lord's sacrifice and to be molded more perfectly in its likeness;
- They should seek to understand the deep spiritual meaning of what they do so to offer themselves daily to God as spiritual sacrifices acceptable to Him through Jesus Christ.

Regarding the Ministry of Acolyte, Canon Law also notes that newly instituted acolytes must regularly exercise their ministry from this point forward if they are to be considered for the possibility of Holy Orders.

This year, Johnny Burnett continues to be involved in multi-dimensional study, prayer and preparation for possible Holy Orders. Academic and formation courses include Sacramental Theology, Christology, Soteriology, Homiletics, Christian Anthropology, Spiritual Theology, Presiding at the Rites, Moral Theology; a retreat for candidates and wives; monthly meetings for theological reflection; monthly Spiritual Direction; and a retreat prior to his institution to the Ministry of Acolyte. He also has been involved in a series of field education and internship experiences. Thus, he continues his four-year preparation as a candidate for the diaconate.

Presently, there are nearly 580 active deacons in the Archdiocese of Chicago, and 75 men (accompanied by their wives, if married) currently participate in the Institute for Diaconal Studies.

Please keep Johnny Burnett, his wife Susan, and all those in formation and their families, in your prayers that they might continue to answer God's call in their lives. Family, friends and parishioners are invited to attend the liturgy/institution. There will be a light reception at USML's Conference Center following the Mass.

WOMEN'S SPIRITUALITY CIRCLES


Women's Spirituality Circles are small groups of women who gather once a month to nourish, reflect upon and share their own spiritual lives. A resource book is used, which enables the

MAC is a group of five or six men who commit themselves to meeting twice a month for one hour to dialogue, support and encourage each other to live the Gospel message more fully in their daily lives. A resource book, based on the daily scripture readings is used. Each daily reflection contains a part of a scripture reading, a contemporary story, a question for one's own life application and a concluding thought for the day. Each man is asked to find ten minutes each day to reflect and pray over the daily reflection. The men involved find that this experience helps them in their daily lives. RESCUE/RECYCLE RELIGIOUS ITEMS MINISTRY




