As Fathers Ron Kalas and Steve Patte knows, the word “retire” for those ordained to the priesthood or the diaconate doesn't mean you stop ministering, it is just an explanation why one now moves a bit slower!

THROUGH OUR ALMS WE TOUCH THE WORLD

Rev. Robert J. Loftus Endowment and Scholarship Fund

The Rev. Robert J. Loftus Endowment and Scholarship Fund was created in 1987 to provide financial support to St. Raymond School families experiencing significant financial hardship. While the primary mission of the fund is to provide St. Raymond School Scholarships to families of parishioners with financial hardship, the fund also supports the school in many other ways.

Over the past 30 years, the Rev. Robert J. Loftus Endowment and Scholarship Fund has provided over \$2.1 million of financial support to our school and parish through:

- Scholarships of over \$1.3 million, which have assisted 550 families and 1,000 children
- Significant annual contributions to the St. Raymond School Teacher Appreciation Fund
- Milestone anniversary service awards to St. Raymond School teachers and staff
- Support for St. Raymond Parish revitalization campaigns

These accomplishments are the result of generous donations, careful evaluation of scholarship applications, and prudent management of our limited financial resources. The only source of contributions to the fund is through donations from parishioners, alumni, and other benefactors. The fund is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, and donations may be tax-deductible depending upon your filing status. Thank you to those who have, and who continue to contribute to the Rev. Robert J. Loftus Endowment and Scholarship Fund.

Even before Shirley MacLaine popularized the *Camino*, in 2000, about the way to Santiago Compostela, pilgrims have been journeying on that road from the 9th century. The Camino or the road to Santiago Compostela in Northwestern Spain is a popular destination for people at the crossroads of life. Santiago is a shrine to St. James the apostle that dates back to nearly the 5th century and has hosted many travelers, pilgrims, guest and tourists. Francis of Assisi did it; Dante did it as well as Stephen Hawking, Angela Merkel and Emilio Estevez. That is where we will begin!

I'm inviting you to join Fr. Jim Presta of St. Emily and me on a journey and trip to Spain and Portugal. This trip is scheduled for September 29th – October 10th of the coming year 2019. Please join us for an information meeting on January 19th at St. Emily at 1pm. In church take a brochure and imagine your self crossing the countryside of Spain and traveling to through the mountains of Portugal to Fatima and Lisbon.

While we will not walk the Camino (500miles) that one can do entirely or in sections, we will have a short trek and then visit the shrine and celebrate Mass at one of the most popular shrines today for seekers of all stripes.

RESCUE/RECYCLE RELIGIOUS ITEMS MINISTRY

Have you wondered what to do with religious items that you no longer want to use or keep? There is a "Rescue and Recycle Program for Religious Items" ministry at St. Raymond's Parish. This ministry was started some years ago by Ruth Hauswirth as a resource for people to be able to re-purpose their religious items that are no longer being used. In past years, thousands of items have been donated and re-purposed. All items are treated in a respectful manner by going to those people or organizations who would again have use for them. The Rescue Ministry will take any type of Catholic religious items: religious statues in any condition, pictures, medals, rosaries, crucifix's, holy cards, blessed candles, scapulars, religious books, holy water/holy oils, Saint relics, Catholic books, cd's or dvd's, and unwanted jewelry (beads and jewelry will be re-purposed and made into rosaries). Items that are broken but fixable are also accepted but we cannot accept Mass or greeting cards from religious organizations. Rescue items that you would like to donate can be brought to the PMC. MAC (MEN OF ACTION AND CONTEMPLATION)

MAC is a group of five or six men who commit themselves to meeting twice a month for one hour to dialogue, support and encourage each other to live the Gospel message more fully in their daily lives. A resource book, based on the daily scripture readings is used. Each daily reflection contains a part of a scripture reading, a contemporary story, a question for one's own life application and a concluding thought for the day. Each man is asked to find ten minutes each day to reflect and pray over the daily reflection. The men involved find that this experience helps them in their daily lives. Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse.", "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."

Would you like to experience the joy of sharing your faith and friendship within a program designed for adults with developmental needs? St. Raymond's SPRED program is looking for a few additional "helpers" to assist our special Friends with planned activities, prayer sessions, refreshments, and more. No prior experience is necessary – just your willingness to share your time, friendship and faith with our SPRED Friends.

SPRED meets bi-weekly on Saturday mornings (9:00am-11:00am) from October through April – a total of 12 sessions. This includes a SPRED Christmas Mass in early December and concludes with a Spring Breakfast in April. 
