A Message From...

Dear St. Raymond Family:

New liturgical guidelines were issued on March 3, 2020 by the Archdiocese of Chicago in order to comply with health recommendations in an effort to avoid possible spread of the coronavirus.

The guidelines for all parishes of the Archdiocese are as follows:

- Anyone who is sick is kindly asked to remain at home. We can all do this with confidence that there is nothing sinful about staying away from the liturgy out of care for the wellbeing of others.
- Holy Water fonts will not be used until further notice.
- The Sign of Peace should be given without physical contact until further notice.
- Holding hands during the Lord's Prayer is suspended until further notice.
- Distribution of the chalice is suspended until further notice.
- All ministers of Holy Communion will use alcohol based hand sanitizer before distributing communion. In order to preserve the dignity and reverence of the Mass, the coordinators will be directing the ministers of communion to go to the sacristy or the chapel during the Sign of Peace for this purpose.
- All parishioners are asked to receive communion in the hand until further notice to avoid direct contact with saliva in the distribution of communion.
- All vessels used at Mass will be washed with soap and hot water after each use.

We are also actively working to ensure that the health and safety of our students remains a top priority. The school and religious education are following all guidelines established through the Archdiocese of Chicago and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). The cleaning service is focusing additional efforts on sanitizing high touch areas in our classrooms and throughout the buildings. There are additional hand sanitizers and antibacteria wipes available in the classrooms.

I appreciate your patience and cooperation with these procedures which will help us all to maintain an attitude of confidence and peace as we worship together.

As good neighbors in our community, we ask St. Raymond parishioners and their quests to observe the Illinois state parking laws when parking on the streets around the parish. Parking a vehicle, whether occupied or not, blocking even partially a public or private driveway, within 15 feet of a fire hydrant, or within 20 feet of a crosswalk is prohibited by law. St. Raymond has a spacious parking lot for our worshipers and visitors. The Village of Mount Prospect





All Hands on Deck in Fourth Grade

The fourth grade has been busy in both science and social studies with hands-on activities. In social studies, students worked in groups to create lighthouses as part of their study of the Southeast region of the United States. Groups designed and built their lighthouses from various supplies. In science, students began their study of physical science. They had opportunities to measure and find the mass and volume of objects, as well as comparing densities. Groups also explored different kinds of forces and energy used to affect the motion of objects. Each volunteer has his own room and bathroom, with full kitchen access. Live-in volunteers can work or go to school full-time during the day or evening, but are on call in case of emergency overnight. They are similar to college resident advisors and are present at Viator House 10 p.m. - 7 a.m. three or four nights each week. They need not stay awake.

Patients at Northwest Community Hospital

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Due to this change in policy, there is no way to know if any of our parishioners are at NCH. Therefore, if a loved one has been hospitalized at NCH, we would deeply appreciate a call or email with this information. This is also true for patients at Lutheran General, Alexian Brothers, and Resurrection Hospitals. Rescue/Recycle Religious Items Ministry Have you wondered what to do with religious items that you no longer want to use or keep? There is a "Rescue and Recycle Program for Religious Items" ministry at St. Raymond's Parish. Thousands of items have been donated and re-purposed. All items are treated in a respectful manner by going to those people or organizations who would again have use for them. The Rescue Ministry will take any type of Catholic religious items: religious statues in any condition, pictures, medals, rosaries, crucifix's, holy cards, blessed candles, scapulars, religious books, holy water/holy oils, Saint relics, Catholic books, cd's or dvd's, and unwanted jewelry (beads and jewelry will be re-purposed and made into rosaries). - Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse."

"I thought I could fix it.",

"I didn't tell anyone."


