





Celebrations



Typically, Easter Vigil celebration is when our parish welcomes new members through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). At St. Raymond we have four catechumens and/or candidates who have been preparing for their Sacraments of Initiation into the Catholic Church. Over the course of a year, the catechumens/candidates and their sponsors have gathered together to learn about the teachings and practices of the Church. They have learned traditional prayers, reflected on the Gospel teachings, and discussed serving Christ and the Church's mission. All of them are active participants in our faith community.

Our catechumens/candidates are already starting to learn to rely on prayer and draw from God's strength as they are being asked to wait patiently for the church's doors to reopen in order to receive their Rites of Initiation into the Catholic Church. Until that time, we are asking our community to come together in prayer to offer support and encouragement to these four individuals, their sponsors, and the RCIA team. The catechumen/candidate profiles are listed below; please include them in your Holy Week daily prayers. May they continued to be fulfilled spiritually with the Word of God as we await to welcome them into full communion with the Church.



RCIA Candidates



Patients at Northwest Community Hospital

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Due to this change in policy, there is no way to know if any of our parishioners are at NCH. Awareness

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report: "I didn't know it was abuse." "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.


