Typically, Easter Vigil celebration is when our parish welcomes new members through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). At St. Raymond we have four catechumens and/or candidates who have been preparing for their Sacraments of Initiation into the Catholic Church. Over the course of a year, the catechumens/candidates and their sponsors have gathered together to learn about the teachings and practices of the Church. They have learned traditional prayers, reflected on the Gospel teachings, and discussed serving Christ and the Church's mission. All of them are active participants in our faith community.

Our catechumens/candidates are already starting to learn to rely on prayer and draw from God's strength as they are being asked to wait patiently for the church's doors to reopen in order to receive their Rites of Initiation into the Catholic Church. Until that time, we are asking our community to come together in prayer to offer support and encouragement to these four individuals, their sponsors, and the RCIA team.
