





The program currently has enrolled almost 500 students and runs almost entirely on the generosity of volunteers. Education program is to help form the youth in their faith and to walk with them in their journey toward a deeper understanding of God in their lives. 

PADS is a ministry of St. Mark Lutheran Church. St. Raymond is a strong supporter of PADS at St. Mark. The goal of the PADS program is to provide hospitality, food, and overnight shelter to the homeless between October 1 and April 30. Last year the St. Mark PADS site hosted 1,486 guests. We averaged 50 guests on any Monday. St. Mark PADS site is open Monday evenings. The site is staffed completely by volunteers. We need volunteers to set up, be on site, prepare and serve food, and to cleanup in the morning. This takes many hands. St. Raymond's has provided many volunteers for this site. We are very thankful for all the time you have given and food you have prepared. Would you consider helping us this year?

The Dream Act of 2017, S. 1615, was recently introduced in the Senate. If passed into law, this bipartisan bill would protect immigrant youth who entered the U.S. as children with "conditional permanent resident status" and a path to full lawful permanent residency and eventual citizenship. This includes the 780,000 young people who received temporary relief from deportation and employment eligibility through the Department of Homeland Security' DACA program.

**ACTION:** The Catholic Church believes in protecting the dignity of every human person and has long supported DREAMERS. Ask your senators to co-sponsor the Dream Act of 2017, by visiting the USCCB website: www.Justiceforlmmigrants.org.




