

Garage Sale Recap

Thanks to all of your donations, and the hard work of many wonderful volunteers, the **Garage Sale again raised over \$7,000** for the parish! Before our expenses, the total was \$7,347.52! Many have asked what happens to those items not sold. Before we have someone come and pick up what is left, we donate to many local charities. All of the vases go to **Random Acts of Flowers** out of Evanston. They recycle flowers and fill the donated vases, then deliver them to people in healthcare centers. Picket Fence Realty in MP is a drop off site for vases. We sent 4 boxes of sturdy shoes and boots, and sweat pants and sweatshirts to **Journeys** for their clients. We sent jackets and coats to the **Lutheran Church of the Cross Food Pantry** where several of our parishioners volunteer. The lightweight jackets and winter coats will be given to those in need who visit the Food Pantry. The leftover children's books went to the **Lions Club** who will distribute them at Christmas time. Many of the adult books were donated to the **MP Library.** We donated men's and women's interview clothing to **CD Cleaners**. During the month of March they were collecting this type of clothing that they dry cleaned and then made available to people seeking a job. We donated extra bedding to the **PADS** site at St. Mark where many St. Raymond parishioners volunteer and leftover fleece blankets went to various **animal shelters.** Everything else was picked up by someone who resells what she can and then donates the rest.

Thanks to the work of the volunteers, everything was sorted, set up and priced before Preview Night on Thursday. In the our quest to learn about the regions of the United States, the fourth grade students focused on Alaska during our study of the West. This unit crossed over multiple subjects. In Social Studies, students researched Alaska and tracked mushers and teams during the famous Iditarod race. The research was used by students in computer class to create Google slide shows to display their information. In Science class, fourth graders gathered supplies to construct their own mini sleds to race. Their goal was to "engineer" the fastest sled that could hold the most cargo. In library and art, students learned about the meaning behind totem poles. Students then worked in groups to erect their own paper totem poles that tell stories of the animals of Alaska. We wrapped up the unit with the 9th Annual I-Kid-a-Rod race around the outside of the school.



- † We will be crowning Mary with a wreath of flowers.


