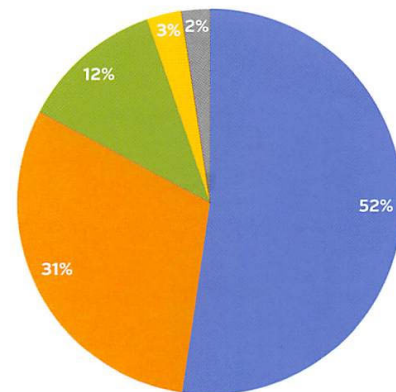

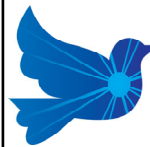
GRANDMOTHERS IN PRAYER

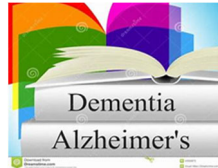

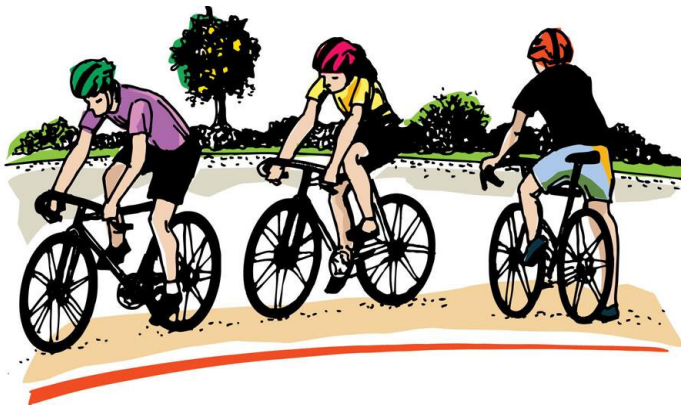

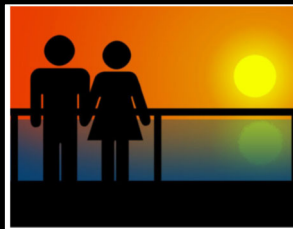
