
Fr. Ed has shared his time, talent, passion, guidance, and leadership with us all... and now it's time for us to come together and

# THROUGH OUR ALMS WE TOUCH THE WORLD



he Peter's Pence Collection has ancient roots that reach all the way back to New Testament times. The early Christians provided material support that the disciples—those preaching the Gospel—could distribute to those in need (see Acts 4:34-35, 11:29). Today, the Peter's Pence Collection is the way we, as members of the Catholic Church, unite ourselves to the concerns of the Holy Father. # How Pope Francis Invites Us to Make the World Less Cold and More Just

Pope Francis encourages us not to "fall into indifference," but rather to "become instruments of God's mercy" (General Audience, November 9, 2016). For "it is precisely in the measure to which we open ourselves to others that life becomes fruitful, society regains peace and people recover their full dignity," Pope Francis teaches us (General Audience, October 26, 2016).

The Rescue Ministry will take any type of Catholic religious items: religious statues in any condition, pictures, medals, rosaries, crucifix's, holy cards, blessed candles, scapulars, religious books, holy water/holy oils, Saint relics, Catholic books, cd's or dvd's, and unwanted jewelry (beads and jewelry will be repurposed and made into rosaries). ## **AWARENESS**

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse."

"I thought I could fix it.",

"I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.


