The vision of Camp Penuel is to love others with God's love. The primary focus of the camp is presenting the love of Jesus to children from shantytown neighborhoods.

The majority of these children don't have the privileges that we so easily take for granted. Most have no access to the lovely Costa Rican countryside and they often have very limited food to eat, some eating only once a day. In their 3 days at Camp, the children are able to "just be kids". They swim, eat nutritious meals each day, do crafts, have bonfires, play games, and learn of the love of Jesus. The camp is free of charge to the children and their families.

Camp Penuel also offers camps for youth, young adults with special needs, AND take Camp Penuel on Wheels (CPOW) to provide service and ministry to the community at large.

Our alms donations for the weekend July 6th & 7th and July 13th & 14th will go to the Camp Penuel Costa Rica. 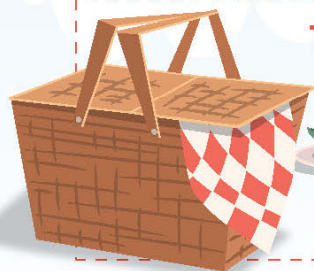

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse."

"I thought I could fix it."

"I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.

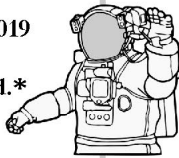

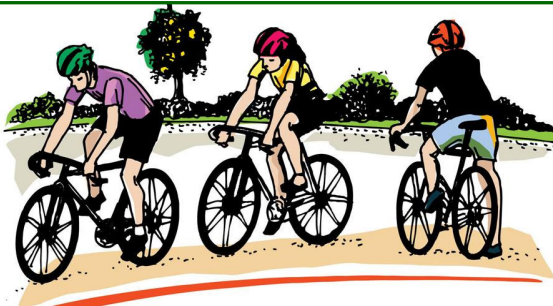

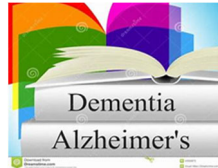


St. Raymond SPRED Program Religious Education for Adults with Special Needs

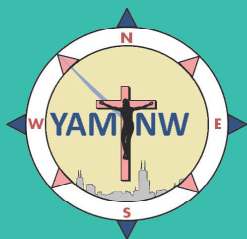
