

Did you know?


- Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the US, and is the 3rd leading cause of deaths among teens.
- In 2017, 47,173 Americans died by suicide (about 129 per day). In comparison, a total of 58,220 Americans were killed during all 20 years of the Vietnam War.
- There were an estimated 1,400,000 suicide attempts in 2017.
- The rate of suicide is highest in middle-age white men in particular. (White males accounted for 69.67% of suicide deaths in 2017.)
- In Illinois, more than four times as many persons died by suicide in 2017 than deaths in alcohol related motor vehicle accidents.

American Foundation for Suicide Prevention was established to promote mental health, and to find better ways to prevent suicide through research and advocacy. We fund research to improve interventions, train clinicians in suicide prevention, and advocate for policy that will save lives.

We are working to create a culture that's smart and well-informed about mental health issues. We provide effective initiatives, including education, a unique Interactive Screening Program, and support programs that are bringing hope to those affected by suicide.

Too many people at risk for suicide do not seek help. We are working to find better ways to reach those who suffer, and encourage schools, workplaces, and communities to make mental health a priority.

Whether you've lost someone or are struggling with suicidal thinking—you are not alone. We bring people who have been affected by suicide out of the darkness, and give them opportunities to help others. Your alms contributions during the weeks of August 24/25, and August 31/September 1 to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention will help to make this possible. Here are some of the many ways to get involved in the St. Raymond Music Ministry. There is a place for you! Waiting for the call? Here it is!

Parish Choir

The Parish Choir supports the worshipping assembly weekly at the Sunday 11:15am liturgy, September through May. It is also the main choir for Midnight Mass and Holy Week celebrations. Aside from the regularly planned songs and responses, this choir presents a wide range of musical repertoire of varying styles. Rehearsals of the Parish Choir take place in the church on **Wednesday** nights from 7:00-9:00pm, and on Sunday mornings before mass at 10:45am. Membership is open to all adults and high school teens who feel the call to serve God and this faith community through sung praise and prayer. **The Parish Choir will start rehearsals on Wednesday, September 4th** in the church. **We will begin singing at mass on Sunday, September 15th.**

Part-time Choir

The Part-time choir is open to all adults who are interested in praising God through singing and/or playing an instrument on a *once-a-month* basis. The Part-time Choir ministers at the 9:30am liturgy normally on the *second* Sunday of every month, unless otherwise noted. Rehearsals take place from 7-9pm on the **Thursday** night before the second Sunday of the month. **September's rehearsal and mass will be on Thursday, September 5th and Sunday, September 8th.**

Instrumentalists

Many devoted instrumentalists volunteer their time and talent in service of the liturgy at St. Raymond. The Instrumentalists are responsible for much of the unique "sound" of our liturgies have become known for. Instrumentalists can include rhythm section instruments such as guitar, bass, drums, and percussion as well as melody instruments such as flute, clarinet, saxophone, violin, cello, etc... A moderate to high level of proficiency is required in order to serve in this ministry, including the ability to read music and/or chord symbols.

Children's Choir

The Children's Choir is made up of boys and girls in grades two through six and provides opportunity for developing musical skills and liturgical understanding through upbeat, spiritual music and frequent participation at masses. It typically sings the first Sunday of the month October through June at the 9:30am liturgy. The Children's Choir will also sing for the Christmas Eve 2pm and Easter Sunday 9:30am Family Masses. For those in grades 4-6, there will be opportunities to begin learning the fundamentals of cantoring through a mentoring process which will lead to real life experience at the cantor podium! Rehearsals of the Children's Choir take place on designated Monday afternoon's from 4-5pm in church. The first rehearsal will be on Monday, September 9th.

Teen Choir

The Teen Choir is open to anyone in grades 7-12 (gals *and* guys!) and ministers on the **4**th **Sunday of the month** at the 9:30am liturgy during the school year. The group will learn and perform more advanced liturgical music repertoire in a variety of styles, with emphasis on four part harmony. They will also have opportunities for semi-regular cantor/solo assignments during liturgies as the year progresses. The Teen Choir also sings for the Christmas Eve 4:30pm Mass. Rehearsals take place in the church from 4-5pm on the **two Tuesdays before the 4**th **Sunday**. The first rehearsals for this group with be on Tuesday, September **10**th and **17**th and its first mass is on Sunday, September **22**nd.

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse."

"I thought I could fix it.",

"I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.

RESCUE/RECYCLE RELIGIOUS ITEMS MINISTRY

Have you wondered what to do with religious items that you no longer want to use or keep? There is a "Rescue and Recycle Program for Religious Items" ministry at St. Raymond's Parish. This ministry was started by Ruth Hauswirth as a resource for people to be able to repurpose their religious items that are no longer being used. Thousands of items have been donated and repurposed. All items are treated in a respectful manner by going to those people or organizations who would again have use for them. The Rescue Ministry will take any type of Catholic religious items: religious statues in any condition, pictures, medals, rosaries, crucifix's, holy cards, blessed candles, scapulars, religious books, holy water/holy oils, Saint relics, Catholic books, cd's or dvd's, and unwanted jewelry (beads and jewelry will be re-purposed and made into rosaries). Items that are broken but fixable are also accepted but we cannot accept Mass or greeting cards from religious organizations. Items that you would like to donate can be brought to the PMC.
