On October 20, we join with the Church around the globe to celebrate World Mission Sunday. This year, the Holy Father has declared the entire month of October an Extraordinary Month of Mission, through which we recommit ourselves to the mission of God in recognition that our faith in Jesus Christ and our relationship with the People of God are missionary by nature. Our faith is a treasure to be given, shared and proclaimed.

This celebration also presents an opportunity to support the global network of missionary commitment, known as the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, through prayer, the soul of mission and charitable offerings from Christians throughout the world. The annual World Mission Sunday second collection provides critical support to communities of faith in the most economically disadvantaged regions of our world. Working with limited means, these local churches bear witness to the Gospel amid poverty and turmoil, addressing all forms of material and spiritual need.

This collection serves:

- Approximately 75 percent supports efforts of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith to help sustain over 1,000 mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Pacific Islands.
- Nearly 10 percent supports the work of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association to alleviate poverty, foster Christian unity and promote interreligious dialogue in the Middle East, Northeast Africa, India and Eastern Europe.
- About 15 percent supports the operations of the Mission Office of the Archdiocese of Chicago, which builds bridges of love and support between global missionaries and members of the Church in Chicago.

In his message for World Mission Sunday this year, Pope Francis states that, "The Church is on mission in the world...Each of us is a mission to the world, for each of us is the fruit of God's love." Those serving in mission at the global peripheries, especially communities and individuals who follow the command to serve despite their own financial struggles, witness this message of service and self-sacrifice. By joining with them, we in turn bear witness to a message of love and compassion so needed in our world today.

The St. Raymond Alms Committee searches out organizations which reflect the needs of the "least of our brothers." All are invited to join our committee which identifies and presents organizations for consideration in weekly alms. AWARENESS

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse."

"I thought I could fix it.",

"I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.

In 2014, Mary was the second person to be honored with Manresa's Lifetime Achievement Award.

It is more important then ever to be aware of the fraud that technology makes possible. Always remember to follow basic safety precautions.

- 1. We are grateful for your generosity in supporting St. Raymond. But, if you wish to donate to the parish, please make all donations directly to St. Raymond Parish. The only gift cards that benefit the parish are those that can be obtained in the parish office. No one should ask you to put purchases for parish ministries on your personal credit card. All ministry related purchases should be made through parish accounts. No one should normally expect to be reimbursed by the parish for something unless you have asked for it to be approved prior to the purchase.
- 2. Never give credit card or gift card information to anyone by email, unless you are making a purchase as part of an account that you have set up with a seller.
- 3. Never provide personal data such as social security number or credit care information to anyone over the phone unless you personally know and trust the individual on the other end of the line.
- 4. If you think that an email might not be genuine, it probably is not. Always contact the sender to verify that the email is authentic. Use the Block Call function on your cell phone to prevent unrecognized callers from calling again.

Also be aware that the National Advertising Initiative Consumer Opt Out website allows you to opt out of unwanted contacts from advertisers.


