During the winter of 1983 the local news media featured several stories on the problem of infant mortality in Chicago and on the effects of malnutrition on the city's infants. In response to the publicity, a group of women, who were friends and fellow-graduates of the Immaculata High School in Chicago became interested. They formed INFANT, Inc. (Infants Need to Find Adequate Nourishment Today).

Infant formula, though vital to the proper nourishment of non-breast-fed babies, is seldom donated to food drives and is not regularly available at many food pantries. New mothers struggling with poverty, awaiting government assistance, have few places to turn for baby formula. INFANT works to supply them during that critical time.

In addition to formula, INFANT provides basic new layettes of infant clothing to newborns living in shelters for the homeless. Besides some basics like t-shirts, sleepers, bottles and diapers, the layettes also include hand-knitted and crocheted items supplied by volunteers.

Because INFANT volunteers do all the purchasing and delivering, and do not use any professional fundraisers, less than 1% of expenses are used for administration.

INFANT, Inc. is extremely grateful to its donors who enable them to continue this important work. Please place all donations in the GREEN Alms envelopes found at every entrance to the church.



# **7th Grade Reflects on Day at Holy Fire**

St. Raymond's 7th and 8th grade students, alongside nearly 8000 young people, gathered last month in Chicago to attend a day of prayer, celebration, worship and fun called Holy Fire. The day began with students enjoying live music from Joe Melendrez and Epic the Band. Students could be seen dancing and singing along to the lyrics, as they praised God through music.



"I saw faith in a different and more modern way. Instead of just going to Mass and listening to prayers, they played a lot of music," said 7th grade student, Hannah.



"I loved how they made music into Christian faith. My favorite moment was adoration. There was one moment where my eyes started to tear up because I could actually feel God's presence." said 7th grader, Lucy.

The students were then given the opportunity to listen to several speakers bear witness to the power of God. Father Rob Galea detailed his difficulty journey that eventually led him to the priesthood. Students were inspired by Father Rob's story. 7th grade student, Neve commented, "I enjoyed the speaker, Father Rob, because his life journey was very inspiring. I thought that he was the best, because his story really touched my heart. It made me think, do I make the right decisions? Am I listening to God?" Likewise, Christian speaker Brian Greensfield also made an impact on students with his story and call to faith. "I could feel God's presence when Brian was talking. He inspired me to pray," stated 7th grader, Connor.

The day wrapped up with a special Mass said by Cardinal Blase Joseph Cupich. Overall, it was a day students will not soon forget, filled with live music, dynamic speakers, praise experiences, and sacramental moments designed to deepen their faith. Another student, Anika, summed up her experience at Holy Fire by stating, "Holy Fire showed me that God didn't just send me here, he sent me here for a purpose. Holy Fire also showed me that we always have to stay alert and really watch for God's messaging."


SPRED is a religious education program specifically intended to meet the spiritual needs of persons with developmental disabilities. St. Raymond's SPRED Program is designed for adults with special needs (21 years of age and older) whom we call Friends. Through the experience of friendship in a one-to-one relationship with a volunteer catechist, each of our Friends discovers a place where they belong and are able to develop a sense of personal dignity as they are helped to realize their own giftedness.
