

Dear Friends:

Today the Baptism of the Lord celebrates Jesus' solidarity with us. Jesus receives baptism for the forgiveness of sins as a sign that he has come to enter into our lives and transform them, so that we can live fully, as men and woman, created in the image of God. Baptism is the way that every Christian enters into the covenant with God and becomes a member of the Church. In baptism we are united with Christ and are given the opportunity to grow into new life that Jesus offers us.

The life of Jesus shows us that the way to growth in new life is service. As a Body of Christ in the world, the Church is called to carry forward Jesus' mission of drawing people together into a new, united human family. Every parish is called to take part in this mission, which is called evangelization. Every baptized Christian receives the gift of the Holy Spirit, and is empowered in a unique way to make a contribution to this mission. Pope Francis tells us that every member of the Church is called to be a "missionary disciple" of Jesus. "All the baptized-whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith —are agents of evangelization. It would be insufficient to envision a plan of evangelization to be carried out by professionals while the rest of the faithful would simply be passive recipients." (Evangelii Gaudium 120)

Over the last several months, I have been working with the two leadership councils to help renew the roles of the lay leadership within St. Raymond Parish. The following pages help to share the vision of their discernment process. These redeveloped councils and commissions offers the opportunity for the Holy Spirit to enter into our dialogue among ministry leaders and members-at-large on how best to engage our ministries, worship, and stewardship initiatives over the next several years. The changes being laid out are not simply my preferences instead of those of another pastor. Rather, they are an attempt to create space for the Holy Spirit to guide us all together toward the renewal for St. Raymond.

The councils and commissions will be focusing on ways to incorporate the 5 essential components of our faith (Pray, Learn, Support, Heal, and Share) to live a life as missionary disciples of Jesus. This will build on the positive efforts of the Parish Transformation Program, and prepare us to take our part in the Archdiocese of Chicago Renew My Church initiative currently in process. Renew my Church calls us to a broader vision than the parish renewal efforts of the past. We all should begin to ask ourselves: *How do we take our parish from maintenance to mission? What does it mean to be on mission as Catholic Christians?* Parishes must look beyond the neighboring streets to reach out to social and professional networks that are the new forms of relationships in the 21st century. Parishes must now see themselves as regional communities that will attract people to Christ their unique expression of Christian life.

Please continue to pray for our community as we look to the future with hope! May the Holy Spirit guide each one of us to consider how we are called to use our unique gifts to contribute to a new vision for the future of St. Raymond.





The best opportunity of the year to support Catholic schools

To increase the funds available for tax credit scholarships*, several donors partnered to create a **matching gift pool**. Every dollar donated to this program through the scholarship granting organization Empower Illinois between Dec. 1, 2019 and Feb. 29, 2020 and designated to a school operated by the Archdiocese of Chicago will be matched with two dollars from this pool (limitations apply). The program will end when all matching funds have been depleted or on Feb. 29, 2020, whichever comes first.

Example: A taxpayer donates \$2,000 to Empower Illinois through the match program. The taxpayer will be eligible to claim a \$1,500 tax credit when he/she files their previous year's taxes. The donation creates \$6,000 in scholarship support (after the \$4,000 match). For the net cost of \$500 (\$2,000 donation less \$1,500 tax credit), this donor will provide a student with a \$6,000 scholarship to attend a Catholic school of his/her choice.

^{*}The Illinois tax credit scholarship program provides a 75 percent state income tax credit to individuals who contribute money to fund scholarships for students from low-income families to attend private schools. Eligible students may use these scholarships to attend a non-public school of their choice, including the more than 200 Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic schools in Cook and Lake counties.

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

"I didn't tell anyone."

The Mt. Prospect Council 6481 Knights of Columbus invites all girls and boys, ages 9 through 14, to participate in the Council level of competition for 2019 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship on Monday, January 20, 2020, at St. Emily's Gym, 1400 E. Central Road, Mount Prospect. Registration starts at 6:00 PM; the competition starts at 6:30 PM. There is no cost to participants.

The Knights of Columbus sponsors the Free Throw Championship annually, with Council winners progressing through District, Region, and State competitions. Girls and boys compete in their respective age and gender divisions. Age eligibility is determined by the age of the contestant as of January 1, 2020. Last year more than 120,000 sharpshooters participated in over 3,600 local competitions. Due to Illinois High School Association by-laws, any 14-year-old high school student on an IHSA Basketball team is ineligible to compete in KofC Free Throw Championship.

All contestants on the Council level will receive certificates for their participation in the event. First and second place champions also receive medallions in their respective age/gender division. Participants are required to furnish proof of age with written parental consent.

The Knights of Columbus is an international Catholic family fraternal service organization with nearly 1.8 million members in over 14,500 local councils. Last year, Knights donated over 70 million volunteer hours and \$162 million to charitable and benevolent causes, sponsoring projects to benefit their parishes, councils, communities, families, and youth.

- 1. We are grateful for your generosity in supporting St. Raymond. But, if you wish to donate to the parish, please make all donations directly to St. Raymond Parish. The only gift cards that benefit the parish are those that can be ordered through the parish office.
- 2. Never give credit card or gift card information to anyone by email, unless you are making a purchase as part of an account that you have set up with a seller.
- Never provide personal data such as social security number or credit care information to anyone over the phone unless you personally know and trust the individual on the other end of the line.
- 4. If you think that an email might not be genuine, it probably is not. Always contact the sender to verify that the email is authentic. Use the Block Call function on your cell phone to prevent unrecognized callers from calling again.

Also be aware that the National Advertising Initiative Consumer Opt Out website allows you to opt out of unwanted contacts from advertisers.

THE LONG GOODBYE

A GATHERING OF HUSBANDS TO SUPPORT EACH OTHERWHILE WALKING THE DIFFICULT IOURNEY WITH A SPOUSE AND DEMENTIA




As good neighbors in our community, we ask St. Raymond parishioners and their guests to observe the Illinois state parking laws when parking on the streets around the parish. Parking a vehicle, whether occupied or not, blocking even partially a public or private driveway, within 15 feet of a fire
