Dear Friends.

Over the last several weeks I have spoken and written about Advent bringing new hope for St. Raymond's to bring renewed vitality to our parish. As we begin the Church's Christmas season we are given a tangible reminder of God's vast love for each of us; He sent His only son, Jesus, to be light of the world. It is through our relationship with Jesus that we are strengthened to carry out our mission to witness to the power of God's love.

This New Year offers us the opportunity, as a community, to make a resolution to faithfully support the mission of St. Raymond. To help us do this, you will see some changes in the way we approach our parish support and charitable giving.

First, we will be eliminating all second collections, including the alms collection, at the weekend Masses. Our giving at Mass will be focused on support of our St. Raymond mission and our ministries, including religious education, pastoral care of the sick, funeral ministry, social justice ministry, and ecumenical outreach. Our mission, and the future growth of our parish, depends on growing these ministries as well as developing new, creative outreach to youth and young adults.

Second, our charitable giving as a parish community will be made from our regular giving, instead of from separate weekly alms collections. St. Raymond has a long history of commitment to charitable giving as a parish community. This is a sign of the health of our parish. Our largest charitable commitment remains the annual assistance we give to St. Raymond School. This support has helped to maintain a standard of excellence in education that has resulted in two National Blue Ribbon awards, and has been a source of life for our parish community. We also support the chaplaincy program at Northwest Community Hospital which benefits people throughout our local area. And lastly, our annual Thanksgiving Mass collection supports the St. Raymond Emergency Fund.

Over the years, we have also supported a variety of causes through the weekly alms collection. Beginning in the New Year, decisions about charitable giving will be part of the responsibility of the newly formed Commission on Fundraising and Parish Partnerships. Members of the alms committee will be an important part of this new commission, which will discern how St. Raymond will partner with charitable causes each year. You will be hearing more about this soon.

Third, those of you who receive packets of envelopes for regular giving will notice a change. The packets will contain only envelopes for Sunday regular giving, for Holy Days, and for the annual collections mandated by the Archdiocese of Chicago. As many of you know, 10% of our weekly regular giving goes to support the Archdiocese of Chicago. The envelopes for the collections mandated by the Archdiocese remain in the envelope packets in order to give donors the freedom to determine how much of their giving goes to the Archdiocese.

Fourth, we would encourage each of you to consider registering and donating through our on-line giving program, Give Central (https://givecentral.org). This option is available for your weekly or monthly giving and special/one-time donations to Saint Raymond Parish. This is a wonderful way to ensure that you are giving consistently to the financial support of the parish.

As you learned recently from our annual financial report, the future of our parish and our school depends upon a renewed commitment from all of our members to the support of our ministries through regular giving. Let us pray that the Spirit will guide us in discerning how each of us is called to participate in the mission of St. Raymond through our generosity.

From the Director of Operations: Year-End Tax Planning

The standard deduction may have been increased, making it less likely that charitable gifts will be itemized, but there are still many ways to make a tax-advantaged gift to the Parish.

Gifts from IRA Accounts

For donors 70½ or older, gifts up to \$100,000 can be made directly from an IRA account. These gifts not only count toward meeting minimum required distributions, they are not subject to income tax and can lower a donor's total income.

Gifts of Stock

Gifts of appreciated stock are among the best ways to give, since those gifts are not subject to capital gains tax, saving you up to 20% on your gift.

"Bunching" Annual Gifts

If you would like to maintain your current annual charitable giving, but are concerned that you might not be able to itemize those gifts, consider "bunching" several years' worth of annual gifts into a single year. You might be able to itemize in your year of giving and then take a standard deduction in the following years, resulting in tax savings.



Frequently asked questions:

What is Kairos?

Kairos, which means "God's time," is a 3-night, 4-day retreat experience for juniors and seniors in high school that enables them to spend time with peers, teen and adult leaders in order to get to know themselves, others, and God more deeply. Teens leave with a deeper understanding of themselves, their values, and their relationship to God.

Why go?

This is a good question. There are so many reasons that others who have been on Kairos might share with you about why you should go. Thousands of teens go on Kairos each year. They discover who they really are and how they want to live. They gain a better sense of themselves, what is important to them, and their relationship with God. Kairos is an experience of a lifetime. Many teens who attend say it was life-changing for them, or at the very least, a powerful and positive experience. Participants often leave with new and/or deeper friendships. Talk to past Kairos participants to learn more.

Who leads the retreat?

Each specific Kairos has a teen leadership team comprised of seniors who have previously attended a Kairos retreat. Leader application and selection began last year in April for this year's retreat. The team completes over 20 hours of training and team building. Adult volunteers from the parish also attend as retreat facilitators. The power of the retreat is that it is student-led, but adult-guided.

Where is it?

Kairos #5 will be held at Cabrini Retreat Center in Des Plaines. Teens gather at St. Raymond on Friday afternoon, take a bus to retreat center, and return to St. Raymond on Monday afternoon. We will leave on Friday, January 17th around 3:30 p.m. and return in the afternoon (around 4:00 p.m.) on Monday, January 20th. Students will NOT have to miss school on Monday because it is the Martin Luther King Jr Holiday.

How much does it cost?

The cost for the 4 day/3 night retreat is \$300. This includes all meals, lodging, supplies, and transportation. However, finances and cost should not deter any teen from attending.

The best opportunity of the year to support Catholic schools

To increase the funds available for tax credit scholarships*, several donors partnered to create a **matching gift pool**. Every dollar donated to this program through the scholarship granting organization Empower Illinois between Dec. 1, 2019 and Feb. 29, 2020 and designated to a school operated by the Archdiocese of Chicago will be matched with two dollars from this pool (limitations apply). The program will end when all matching funds have been depleted or on Feb. 29, 2020, whichever comes first.

Example: A taxpayer donates \$2,000 to Empower Illinois through the match program. The taxpayer will be eligible to claim a \$1,500 tax credit when he/she files their previous year's taxes. The donation creates \$6,000 in scholarship support (after the \$4,000 match). For the net cost of \$500 (\$2,000 donation less \$1,500 tax credit), this donor will provide a student with a \$6,000 scholarship to attend a Catholic school of his/her choice.

*The Illinois tax credit scholarship program provides a 75 percent state income tax credit to individuals who contribute money to fund scholarships for students from low-income families to attend private schools. Eligible students may use these scholarships to attend a non-public school of their choice, including the more than 200 Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic schools in Cook and Lake counties.



St. Raymond's SPRED Program

SPRED is a religious education program specifically intended to meet the spiritual needs of persons with developmental disabilities. St. Raymond's SPRED Program is designed for adults with special needs (21 years of age and older) whom we call Friends. Through the experience of friendship in a one -to-one relationship with a volunteer catechist, each of our Friends discovers a place where they belong and are able to develop a sense of personal dignity as they are helped to realize their own giftedness.

Through participation in a SPRED community of faith, Friends and catechists alike share how God has touched our lives and lives through us. Through prayer, activities, and fellowship/agape, our Friends develop a sense of the sacred, a sense of the Church, and a sense of God. As a result, our Friends are better able to enter into the worshiping experiences of the whole Church. We meet at St. Raymond every other Saturday morning from 9:00–11:00am during the school year (October through April).


