Dear St. Raymond Family,

My prayers continue to accompany our entire community as we adjust to the restrictions necessary to control COVID-19. I am grateful to our parish staff for their compassionate and creative response to the special needs that have resulted from this health crisis. We are in prayer in a special way for those who are sick, and who are especially vulnerable to this health threat.

St. Paul expresses his confidence that any affliction can be turned into an inspiration for mutual care and support. Let us continue to care for one another by checking in, especially with those who are isolated by health concerns, and by prayer for one another.

This is an update on St. Raymond Parish efforts to respond to the measures that we are being asked to adopt.

Campus Events, Classes, and Meetings

The entire St. Raymond campus is closed until further notice. ***All meetings, classes (including Religious Education), and events that were scheduled are officially canceled effective Friday, March 13, 2020. This extends to any St. Raymond parish off-site small group meetings.*** At this time we are postponing the Garage Sale until we have additional guidelines. These precautions are being enacted out of concern for the health and safety of our parishioners. At this time we are awaiting further direction from both the Governor of Illinois and Archdiocese of Chicago.

Parish Ministry Center (PMC) and Staff

Effective immediately, the PMC office will be closed to the public until further notice. A staff member will be available by phone (847-253-8600) daily from 8:30 a.m. – noon to help answer questions or concerns during these uncertain times.

Our staff is also accessible through individual email, phone, or website directory listing. We are available to help in any way that we can during this period, please continue to reach out as needed.

The parish staff has selected books from our Skach Library and placed them in a plastic bin to offer to you reading material. ***The Book Bin will be available daily from 8:30 a.m. – noon outside the PMC entrance door.*** The book bin will NOT be out during inclement weather or overnight. We kindly ask to take one book at a time and return it to the bin.

*Please note: The books are NOT cleaned daily and we do not know who will be accessing the bin on any given day.

Parish Masses

During this difficult time, we recognize it is particularly important that the faithful have access to the grace and comfort of Holy Mass. St. Raymond will continue to offer a live stream (on-line) Mass 11:00 a.m. on Sundays. Please check our website www.st-raymond.org to access the live stream.

In-person masses and regular weekly sacramental schedule are suspended effective immediately, including confession until further notice.

In addition to our on-line Sunday liturgy, we invite you to watch and participate in the celebration of Sunday, Saturday evening, and Daily Masses using the internet or television. **A Resource list can be found in the bulletin and on the website with both Mass information, as well as, family sites, podcasts, and other resources to explore.** We will continue to update and add to this list of resources in the upcoming weeks. Prayer Chapel

We are concerned for the safety and well-being of all parishioners. We do not feel that we are able to maintain the sanitizing of the prayer chapel in a consistently reliable way. ***Therefore, effective immediately, the prayer chapel will be closed to the public until further notice.***

Prayer is essential to finding peace and calm during this crisis. We encourage the use of the **outdoor O' Brien Gardens for prayer.** Additional benches have been added offer a peaceful area for prayer on our campus.

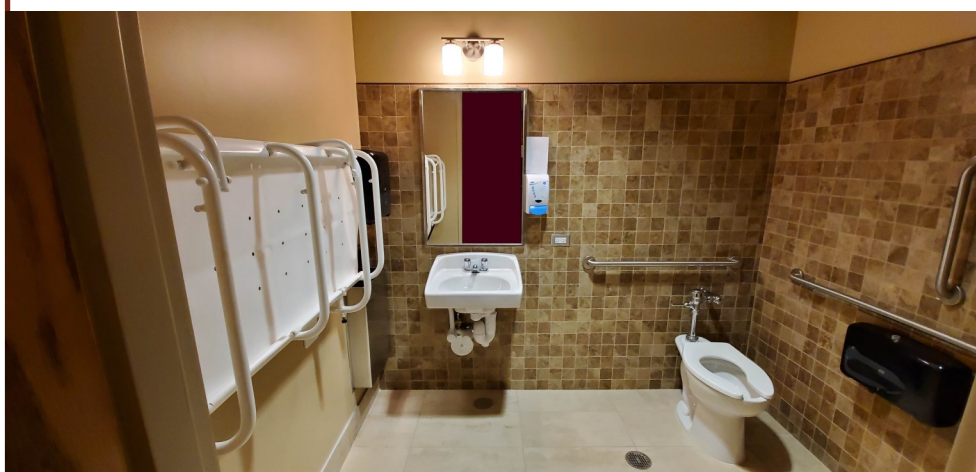

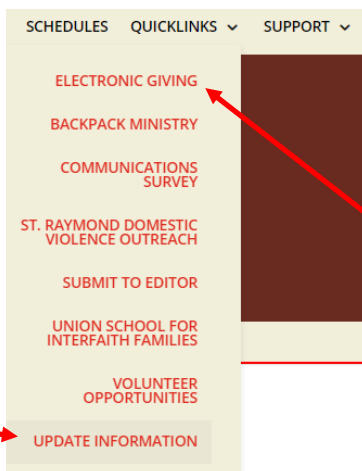

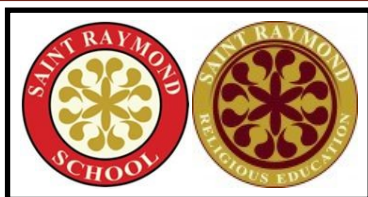

New Resources and Support at SRS

St. Raymond seeks to address the whole student. This year, St. Raymond installed a sensory hallway, purchased from Krazy Maze. The sensory hallway includes activities such as wall push-ups, balancing on a log, hand over hand, frog jumps or leaps, and a focus maze. According to Krazy Maze, these activities provide children with various types of sensory input such as proprioceptive input (heavy work/weight bearing through joints) and vestibular input (moving body through space) as well as incorporating crossing mid-line and improving the development of both gross motor skills and visual motor skills. The sensory hallway is for all students as it helps regulate children for learning. The Krazy Maze can improve cognitive functioning and assist with calming or alerting type strategies.



Students at St. Raymond use the Sensory Hallway to help their bodies reset and return to class.

In addition to providing students with the opportunity to utilize this unique resource, St. Raymond recently provided parents with a couple of opportunities to gather information and support on the topics of sensory integration and anxiety. In February, Dr. Angie Harisiadas, Occupational Therapist from In2GreatTherapy spoke to parents about sensory integration and the challenges that could be impacting day to day functioning and behaviors. Earlier this month, through a special screening of the movie, Angst, parents began to identify and understand the symptoms of anxiety and various strategies for managing anxiety. Patients at Northwest Community Hospital

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse."
"I thought I could fix it."
"I didn't tell anyone."
