Dear St. Raymond Family:

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:4-7)

St. Paul reminds us that the source of peace during the common crisis we face is the link that we have with God and one another in prayer. Prayer with and for others unites us as we are separated. In prayer, there is no social distancing. St. Paul also reminds us that an attitude of thanksgiving is our continued source of joy. It is easy to focus on what we have lost or cannot do as we are confined to our homes. We can counter that by giving thanks daily for each other and by looking for the ways that the Lord is providing for us.

Last week, we received the news that we will not be able to celebrate Holy Week in public worship. While this is definitely not what was planned for our community, we are thankful for the resources to live stream Masses to keep connected with our community from their homes. St. Raymond will continue to live stream Sunday Masses at 11:00 a.m., through our website: http://www.st-raymond.org/, for at least the next three weekends including Palm Sunday, and Easter – we hope you will join us. During Holy Week, I am encouraging our community to join in unity with the Archdiocese of Chicago by viewing the services streamed from Holy Name Cathedral. To access the Archdiocese livestreams go to: https://radiotv.archchicago.org/television/broadcast-masses. Jesus prayed for all of his disciples "that they all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that the world may believe that you sent me". (John 17:21). There is no greater unity than unity in prayer. So, let us unite with our sisters and brothers across the Chicago Archdiocese to witness to our faith in Jesus Christ.

In addition to live streaming weekend Mass, we are offering additional resources to enrich your prayer life including a family faith focus section that offers Lenten activities, Order of the Mass, and praying the Rosary. These resources are updated frequently and can be found on the St. Raymond website: http://www.st-raymond.org/welcome/ways-to-pray/.

I recognize that this is a time of financial challenges for our families; this is true for our parish family as well. Our parish and school ministries continue to depend on your generosity as the staff continues to work hard to support the parish and community, during this challenging time and beyond, through enhanced communication efforts.

Some of you may be aware of the sites set up by the Archdiocese of Chicago for universal online giving to any parish, and an emergency fund promising tuition support for Catholic school students. Pastors have received no specific information regarding how these funds will

be dispersed with this form of giving. The best way to support St. Raymond remains to give directly to the parish, as you have been doing. Our main resource for online giving is Give Central. This is a secure website where your financial data is safe and can be entered with confidence. Please visit our secure online giving through our website: http://www.st-raymond.org/electronic-giving/. Give Central allows you to give a one-time gift or create an account for reoccurring donations. Those who have already submitted donations can be confident that the parish staff will process those and see that they are received by CRS.

Finally, please be aware of scams. A time of crisis is a time for scam artists to con others. Please be assured that neither I, nor any member of the parish staff, will ever ask you to use your own personal funds to purchase anything. Any request appearing to come from me or any member of the parish staff must be considered to be a scam. The way to give is not to respond to seeming requests from priests or staff and to give directly to the parish.

Be assured of my prayers for all of you. The parish and school staffs continue to be here to serve you and appreciate your support and suggestions.

that facilitates the shelter program for the homeless. St. Raymond PADS ministry partners with St. Mark Church to host 60 + guests on Monday evenings. For the health and safety of our volunteers and guests we had to close our doors as of March, 23.

Journeys has established an Emergency Hotel Fund to provide housing for their clients for the duration of the pandemic. They anticipate the need to house 100 guests for many weeks. The Viatorians have provided a donation to the fund 60 guests. More monies are needed to house all of our guests and feed them.

- ~use dry erase markers on the door or window






E-learning from preschool to 8th grade

Patients at Northwest Community Hospital

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Due to this change in policy, there is no way to know if any of our parishioners are at NCH. Therefore, if a loved one has been hospitalized at NCH, we would deeply appreciate a call or email with this information. This is also true for patients at Lutheran General, Alexian Brothers, and Resurrection Hospitals. Awareness

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report: "I didn't know it was abuse." "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.


