Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The St. Raymond Leadership Team is happy to announce that we have received our reopening certification from the Archdiocese of Chicago and may move forward with our "Parish Reopening Plan". We are reopening the church for both private prayer and sacraments including: Reconciliation, Funerals, Baptisms, and Weddings beginning on Wednesday, June 3, 2020. For now, the PMC Office will remain closed for visitors but continue to have phone coverage available Monday-Friday between 8:30 a.m. – noon.

Private prayer and reconciliation times are listed below.

Private Prayer in Church (Seniors):

Mondays 8:00–8:30 a.m. Thursdays 4:00-4:30 p.m. (To register call the PMC office 847-253-8600)

Reconciliation in Chapel (Seniors):

Wednesdays 11:00 a.m.—noon (To register call the PMC office 847-253-8600)

Private Prayer in Church (All Ages):

Mondays 9:00–9:30 a.m., 10:00–10:30 a.m., and 11:00-11:30 a.m. Thursdays 5:00-5:30 p.m., 6:00-6:30 p.m., and 7:00-7:30 p.m. (Registration is on-line)

Reconciliation in Chapel (All Ages):

Wednesdays 10:00–11:00 a.m. (Registration is on-line)

Only the above times are available and individuals MUST pre-register 24-hrs in advance of time/date selected. Registration links can be found below or on the website, www.st-raymond.org. We are offering separate times for private prayer & confession for our senior population. Although you are free to sign up for any slot, if you feel more comfortable, we have set aside these times for you. Please call the PMC front office at 847- 253-8600 to register for these times in advance.

Please be aware of the parish guidelines for private prayer and reconciliation:

- Private prayer times are limited to 10 individuals or less with social distancing rules in effect.
- All visitors must wear a mask upon entering and use provided hand sanitizer.
- A greeter(s) will be present to help check-in and direct individuals to their seats.

The staff and ministry teams are very eager to celebrate these sacraments and will do our best to accommodate everyone. Please note, if your child's baptism was postponed, you will be contacted by staff with the upcoming dates available to receive the sacrament.

The health of our parishioners remains our highest priority and we are following the disinfecting guidelines to help mitigate the spread of the virus and ensure the safety of all entering the parish facilities. While we hope that everyone will feel comfortable to participate, it is up to each person individually to weigh the risks and make a decision that is right for you.

SnapChat, TikTok, HouseParty... before you have time to view and approve, the next social media app is out. Technology at our fingertips is ever-changing. This spring/summer, we are highlighting some of the apps that your kiddos may be asking about, or have already downloaded.

The majority of apps are okay and safe to use (of course, not ALL apps), but the best way to be in control of the safety features is monitoring the devices.

Reminder: the keys to safety is monitoring the devices and keeping an open conversation, especially about feelings and emotions. If the child/youth ever feels uncomfortable with something they see or hear, they should be able to tell a trusted adult.

Let's dig a bit into TikTok:



Note: TikTok app used to be called Music.Ly



This app is one of the most popular! Who doesn't love *Dadasaurus* or the dance & moves for the *Banana Challenge*? It's hilarious, and distracting! There is plenty of room for creativity and fun, but there is also plenty of room for things to go wrong.

Keeping our youth safe...

+Take a look at the settings: this app starts out as a PUBLIC page, which means anyone and everyone (even those with a Private profile) can contact the user with a Public setting.

HOW TO CHECK:

- +At the bottom of the app screen, go to "Me" > Click on the 3 dots in the top-right (...) > Account > Privacy and safety
 - -Now, you can make the account Private, and make preferences about who can view the profile contents and when.
 - -Note: a popular thing to do is add the school name in the "Bio" again, just click on "Me" at the bottom of the app.

+With each creation, you can:

- -record live
- -upload older/pre-recorded videos and photos
- -add text
- -put videos to music/another user's recording (like a voice-over)
- -"Duet" with someone

A few other things to know:

- +There is something called For You Page (#fyp), which uses algorithms based on videos "liked" or viewed (searched), age, location... the works. This can bring up topics and conversations that some youth may not be ready to see or hear.
- +With a Public profile, if the user does not select to "Only Allow Comments from Friends", then anyone and everyone can comment. There are a lot of supportive TikTok-ers out there, but there are also some who want to break the spirit of others with mean, uncalled-for comments.



Patients at Northwest Community Hospital

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Due to this change in policy, there is no way to know if any of our parishioners are at NCH. Therefore, if a loved one has been hospitalized at NCH, we would deeply appreciate a call or email with this information. This is also true for patients at Lutheran General, Alexian Brothers, and Resurrection Hospitals. Awareness

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report: "I didn't know it was abuse." "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.
