

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I first want to thank each of you for your patience throughout this pandemic and for your continued faithfulness to St. Raymond Parish. The staff and I recognize that navigating the COVID-19 crisis over the last few months has been challenging for our tight knit community. It has been difficult and emotional for our parishioners to be separated from our loved ones and each another. The hardship coupled with grief is palpable both in Mount Prospect and around the world. And yet over the last 3 months we have witnessed compassion and love from so many individuals. Whether you took care of your family, checked in with neighbors/loved ones, called parishioners through our Guardian Angels, are an essential worker, coordinated prayer or zoom meetings, or used your gifts or ministries to outreach to those in our community— You are sharing the love that Jesus Christ has for each of us as human beings through your actions.

Like many of you, I am looking forward to the day when we can gather together for worship in the church. Not being able to be physically present in worship the way we envision might be hard for some, and yet it is what we are called to do at this moment. The sacrifices we are making are an expression of our belief in the value of every human life, and our desire that no one suffer. Just as the Father and Son are united in the communion of the Holy Spirit, so are we united in God through the communion of the Holy Spirit. It is through this communion with the Holy Spirit that our community is built. So, whether we can physically worship together or not, that bond cannot be broken. No trial has come to you but what is human. God is faithful and will not let you be tried beyond your strength; but with the trial he will also provide a way out, so that you might be able to bear it. (1Corinthians 10:13)

The Reopening Leadership Team is prayerfully discerning and listening to the way the Spirit is guiding us in balancing the health and safety of those who will visit the church with the desire to gather together. Currently, St. Raymond is certified by the Archdiocese of Chicago for Phases I and IA, which allows us to hold private prayer and sacraments for 10 persons or less in the church. St. Raymond just opened last week for phases I and IA; offering private prayer and sacraments has been a positive step for our parish community. Phase II guidelines were recently released by the Archdiocese of Chicago. As a parish, we first must conduct Phases I and IA for several weeks before we can explore certification for Phase II.

There are many components to consider as we make every effort to ensure the safety and welfare of staff, volunteers, and members entering/exiting into the church or the campus. The Reopening Leadership Team and staff will begin exploring options that are viable for us, in line with the Archdiocese of Chicago guidelines. **We hope to begin to move into Phase II the first week of July.** As we move

forward together, it is important that we not compare ourselves to what other parishes are doing. Each parish is unique in size and in what their spaces may allow them to do. Our Reopening Leadership Team decided from the beginning that we would take a careful approach that does everything possible to avoid placing anyone at risk as we gradually reopen.

We will continue to communicate to our parishioners throughout this process. I urge you, to be on the parish email list, visit the website www.st-raymond.org regularly, and/or follow St. Raymond's on social media (Facebook, IInstagram, and Twitter @StRaymondMPIL). These 3 platforms enable the parish staff to push information quickly to our parishioners. All online communication is also available in the parish bulletin, but can be delayed for a week depending on publication dates.

The Parish Ministry Office will be open Monday – Friday from 8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. beginning on Monday, June 15, 2020. Our staff is available to help answer questions, help register you for private prayer or sacraments, and connect you to zoom prayer groups or other small groups/ministries. My prayers continue for you and your families during these summer months.



SnapChat, TikTok, HouseParty... before you have time to view and approve, the next social media app is out. Technology at our fingertips is ever-changing. This spring/summer, we are highlighting some of the apps that your kiddos may be asking about, or have already downloaded.

The majority of apps are okay and safe to use (of course, not ALL apps), but the best way to be in **Reminder: the keys to safety is** control of the safety features is monitoring the devices.

monitoring the devices and keeping an open conversation, especially about feelings and emotions. If the child/youth ever feels uncomfortable with something they see or hear, they should be able to tell a trusted adult.

Let's dig a bit into HouseParty:

This app is very fun for all ages! This app is a live video call (similar to FaceTime or Skype), and is not recorded (unless someone uses the Screen Recorder on their device).

The safety features of this app are better than most. Each account holder creates a profile. The only way to communicate with someone is by accepting a friend request.

+What's the big deal with this app?

You can play games with friends and be on a video call with multiple friends at the same time!

To add friends, you can search their username, search your contacts on your device, search Facebook, or share your unique link for others to find you.

If a friend is not available, you are able to leave a "Facemail" (in short, a recorded video message).

Keeping our youth safe...

+Make sure the room is "Locked" (bottom of the screen) once all "Friends" have joined

+In Advanced Settings, you are able to set who can see when you are on ("In the House"). Likewise, you are able to set who you want to see is "In the House"

Note from Cheryl: my nieces and I use this app a lot, and like to play QuickDraw, which is similar to Pictionary

Patients at Northwest Community Hospital

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Due to this change in policy, there is no way to know if any of our parishioners are at NCH. Therefore, if a loved one has been hospitalized at NCH, we would deeply appreciate a call or email with this information. This is also true for patients at Lutheran General, Alexian Brothers, and Resurrection Hospitals. St. Raymond Parish Domestic Violence Outreach

AWARENESS

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report: "I didn't know it was abuse." "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."
