

Happy Father's Day

One of the advantages of being older is to have the opportunity to watch the world change. I have discovered that sometimes, it is not always for the better. However, most of the time, change can bring forth an exciting new and far better way of life. Through the years of being involved with the Baptism Ministry, I have especially enjoyed watching the developing changes to that vocation we call fatherhood. While I have no proof, I tend to believe the ever-changing role of being a father happens through a gift from a mother, who encourages him to experience a more intimate role of being a parent.



The role of fatherhood has always been to help his children grow to be people of integrity, compassion, with a sense of humor, and a sense of fairness, and to be a person who is tender with their power. He does so by living the example.

However, I believe there is still even a greater gift a father can give to his children and that is how to handle adversity in life; of handling the moments of difficulty when things seem to go wrong; times of failing, loss and disappointment. How a father handles those times could be one of the greatest gifts he teaches his children, because we know those days will come and someone has to teach them how to respond to adversity or they will just give up.

Jeremiah, in today's first reading, speaks of hearing those voices calling out in fear. Desperate and filled with doubt, everything seems lost to them. Adversity surrounds them as if the tailwind that once effortlessly moved them forward, has now become the headwind that paralyzes them in life.

Jesus said to the Twelve and to all disciples....

"Fear no one. Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known...

- ... And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul...
- ... So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows...

Three times in today's Gospel, Jesus tells us "Do not be afraid." Jesus calls us to let go and to trust completely in faith, knowing of God's promise to be with us, always. If only we could embrace it, believe it and live it, then no failures, challenges, weaknesses, or losses we might face in life will ever overcome us.



Jesus not only tells us, he also shows us. Jesus' entire life and ministry was surrounded with doubt and opposition. Even at the Cross, those who followed him, abandoned him. But through it all, Jesus knew he was doing the Father's will; that was his mission. Jesus knew his Father would never abandon him.

When we have the strength to overcome uncertainly, fear, and self-pity in the times of adversity, when we can embrace our faith and truly trust that God will, indeed, always be watching over us, then we can stand tall and lean into any storm. We can almost welcome the challenge because God will see us through it. But we need someone to teach us to trust in faith over and over and to remind us. Just imagine if a father can live the example of Jesus; if, in the face of adversity, he can respond in faith and courage, then he has something to teach his children and the rest of us too.

Dads, it is my prayer that on this Father's Day, you and I can pledge to let this be our gift to our children. Let's make it our legacy to our children and to all the generations yet to come.




HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!

Parish Office Hours



Patients at Northwest Community Hospital

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Due to this change in policy, there is no way to know if any of our parishioners are at NCH. Therefore, if a loved one has been hospitalized at NCH, we would deeply appreciate a call or email with this information. This is also true for patients at Lutheran General, Alexian Brothers, and Resurrection Hospitals. Awareness

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report: "I didn't know it was abuse." "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.
