

A letter from our Pastor...

July 5, 2020

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

St. Raymond Reopening Leadership Team and staff are pleased to announce the parish may begin to offer public masses under the Phase II certification from the Archdiocese of Chicago. We will reopen the Church for public (in-person) weekday and weekend Masses starting the week of July 6, 2020. We are excited for the opportunity welcome you back to in-person Mass.

Attendance numbers are limited by Archdiocese of Chicago and State of Illinois COVID-19 directives, so initially we are allowed to have only 50 people at each Mass, exclusive of ministers. We hope to be able to increase that number to allow up to 20% of our Church capacity over the next several weeks.

Our schedule will be as follows:

WEEKDAY MASSES

Wednesday at 9:00 a.m., plus live streaming – starting July 8, 2020 Thursday at 12:00 p.m. (noon) – starting July 9, 2020

WEEKEND MASSES

Saturday at 5:00 p.m., plus live streaming – starting July 11, 2020 Sunday at 8:30 a.m. – starting July 12, 2020 Sunday at 11:00 a.m., plus live streaming – starting July 12, 2020

RECONCILIATION

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available each Saturday, beginning July 11, from 4:00-4:30 p.m. with four slots are available.

All masses and reconciliation require <u>preregistration</u> to attend. There will be **no walk-ins** at this time. To preregister to attend mass and for more detailed information, including a video, to help prepare you for your arrival, please visit the website at <u>www.st-raymond.org</u>. If you require assistance registering, please contact the parish office at 847-253-8600.

The health and safety of our parishioners continues to remain our highest priority. We are looking forward to reuniting with you for mass, but understand the risks associated with the spread of COVID-19 might prevent you and/or family from attending Mass. It is up to each person to make a decision that is right for you and your family. <u>Dispensation from Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation continues from the Archdiocese of Chicago</u>.

The parish will offer live stream Masses on Wednesday at 9:00 a.m., Saturday at 5:00 p.m., & Sunday at 11:00 a.m. through our website: www.st-raymond.org. We hope you will continue to participate with us for masses until you are able to join us in-person.

The PMC Office is open Monday-Friday between 8:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. to answer any questions or assist you with registering, please call 847-253-8600. I am grateful for your hope-filled patience during this pandemic and reopening phases. The staff and I are eager to welcome you back into the church for mass. In the meantime, my prayers continue for St. Raymond parishioners and our community as we enter into Phase II of Reopening.

is a process of companioning people as they come to greater faith. It is designed for men and women who:


have never been baptized

Did you hear?

St. Raymond Religious Education will continue for the 2020-2021 school year, but with a new format.

While we would love to be on-site weekly, we do not have the capacity (time, money, supplies) to meet the requirements to properly distance, and to properly sanitize the rooms & shared supplies. We are concerned that requiring students to wear a face mask for an additional 90-minutes after a full school day may be difficult for many. We also know and understand that online learning does not appeal to many students, especially after "eLearning" this past Spring.

OUR CURRENT PLAN is to have a hybrid of online and on-site (special event by grade level) for the 2020-2021 school year at St. Raymond Religious Education. This means that the majority of classes will be done at-home, with provided tools and materials (something similar to a "subscription box").

The Archdiocese of Chicago did approve us to lower our number of required Catechetical Hours by using this option.





In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Due to this change in policy, there is no way to know if any of our parishioners are at NCH. Therefore, if a loved one has been hospitalized at NCH, we would deeply appreciate a call or email with this information. This is also true for patients at Lutheran General, Alexian Brothers, and Resurrection Hospitals. AWARENESS

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report: "I didn't know it was abuse." "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.
