The History of St. Raymond Church

The early beginnings of the St. Raymond Parish are rooted in the history of the adjoining parishes in Arlington Heights and Des Plaines. It breathes of the rapid development of the suburban area of metropolitan Chicago, and the influx of new industry, and with it the phenomenal growth in population, which hastened the development of the Mount Prospect area.

In the late forties, the foresight of the late Cardinal Samuel Stritch visualized the need for a new parish which would serve the people within the boundaries of the Mount Prospect area.

In 1949 the parish officially came to life with the promulgation of the Decrees on July 10, 1949, and Father Thomas J. O'Brien chaplain of St. Theresa Hospital in Waukegan, was assigned to the new parish, as pastor, with the task of organizing and building adequate facilities to serve the people within its boundaries. At that time there were 125 families in the parish. The first Mass was celebrated on July 17, 1949, in the Central School building.



The Steinmiller Family have been members of St. Raymond since the 50s Mary Nell and Fred (Jack) had 8 children all attended St Raymond school, the oldest (George) Alex joined the Passionist order of missionary priests, after being the first graduating class of St. Raymond.

The family lived at 220 S Owen St. Then moved to 309 S I-oka Ave, the current rectory. Three private residences were purchased by the Archdiocese, so the family sold & moved a block north to 218 S I-Oka in 1965, a residence owned by the church. St. Raymond sold the house to the Steinmiller Family where they resided until 2005. Currently, three members of the family still live in the area. Fred Jr still an active member of St Raymond.

Golden Jubilee of Passionist Priesthood

June 13, 1970 ~ June 13, 2020

50th Anniversary of Priesthood – Fr. George Alex Steinmiller, C.P.

June 13th, 1970 I was ordained a Catholic priest at St. Thomas the Apostle Church in Hyde Park, Chicago, and celebrated my first Mass at St. Raymond's the following day, June 14th.

In the fall of 1952, my parents, Jack and Nell Steinmiller moved our small family (then) to Mt Prospect. St. Raymond parish was three years old. Our first "church" was in the basement of my school, Central School. You can locate that site in the lower parking deck of the Mt. Prospect Library!

To make a long, rich story short I will just say that I spent my 8th grade at St. Raymond's School. Our class of 12 was the first graduating class of the parish! When I was in seventh grade, I had met a Passionist missionary during a youth mission at the parish, Fr. Charles Guilfoyle, C.P. He kept in touch with me through the next year and ended up inviting me to attend Mother of Good Counsel Seminary in 1957. The rest is history.

What is most important is not to underestimate, nor take for granted the ways that God is working through St. Raymond's parish. I encourage every young man to include the priesthood in your future dreams. Frankly, I thought it was a "crazy idea" when the thought struck me during the sixth grade! Does not St. Paul tell us that we are "fools for Christ's sake?" (1 Cor. 4:10) As I look back over 50 years of Passionist priesthood the thought comes to me that the priesthood is God's work, not mine. We only have to give God the room to work...by giving God our all. That is what I have sought to do over the years.

And I am grateful that the "birthplace" of my vocation was right there in your parish. In the fall, once we are into the "new normal, post-pandemic" I hope to celebrate Mass with all of you.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Each year all the parishes send their RCIA candidates, sponsors and team to Holy Name Cathedral for the "Rite of Election." There are so many people involved that this prayer service is offered five times during Lent – and the cathedral is filled each time.

One of the most important aspects of our life at St. Raymond Parish is our continued efforts to share our faith with others. We do this in so many ways: through our liturgies, formation and education programs, outreach programs and our socializing and hospitality. We continually strive to create an atmosphere where **God's active presence** will be **discovered among us**.

Sometimes all we need is a **gentle invitation** -- a little encouragement from someone to do something that we've been thinking about for a long time -- a little encouragement to stop putting something off -- and recognize that perhaps now is the time to take action. We encourage you, our parishioners, to prayerfully consider people you know -- a spouse, friend, relative, co-worker, or neighbor -- and invite them to explore our faith.

The **RCIA** (**R**ite of **C**hristian **I**nitiation of **A**dults) is designed for women and men who have never been baptized or who were baptized in another Christian denomination and are considering becoming Catholic. It is also appropriate for baptized Catholics who have received little formal religious education or who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation.

The RCIA is a wonderful process, involving some of our own parishioners who accompany the candidates on their faith journey. REGISTRATION IS OPEN!

St. Raymond Religious Education **will continue** for the 2020-2021 school year, but **with a new format**.

While we would love to be on-site weekly, we do not have the capacity (time, money, supplies) to meet the requirements to properly distance, and to properly sanitize the rooms & shared supplies. We are concerned that requiring students to wear a face mask for an additional 90-minutes after a full school day may be difficult for many. We also know and understand that online learning does not appeal to many students, especially after "eLearning" this past Spring.

OUR CURRENT PLAN is to have a hybrid of online and on-site (special event by grade level) for the 2020-2021 school year at St. Raymond Religious Education. This means that the majority of classes will be done at-home, with provided tools and materials (something similar to a "subscription box").







Patients at Northwest Community Hospital

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Due to this change in policy, there is no way to know if any of our parishioners are at NCH. Therefore, if a loved one has been hospitalized at NCH, we would deeply appreciate a call or email with this information. This is also true for patients at Lutheran General, Alexian Brothers, and Resurrection Hospitals. AWARENESS

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report:

"I didn't know it was abuse."
"I thought I could fix it."
"I didn't tell anyone."

These are traps that keep people bound.
