On behalf of the Reopening Leadership Team and parish staff, I want to thank you all for your continued patience in the reopening process and adherence to the archdiocesan and parish procedures for masses and sacraments. We are grateful to those who have come to church for your dedication to our social responsibility to protect others. We continue to pray for everyone what each person will discern the choices that are best for the health of our families during this pandemic. God is with us wherever and however we choose to worship.

I would like to express special thanks to the volunteers who have offered to accompany those who are coming for services in church, and to the members of our facilities team who have been doing an outstanding job with cleaning and disinfecting. Without their contributions, we could not move forward.

In the upcoming weeks we are anticipating to be able to increase our seating for all masses by utilizing more pews within the church. This will increase our overall capacity to the 15-20% of the total occupancy for worship, which is currently the maximum capacity under the reopening guidelines of the Archdiocese of Chicago. All current procedures will remain in place, including preregistration and face masks during the entire time in church.

For our parishioners who continue to join us in worship from your home, we have been working hard to offer a high quality live stream that is engaging for you and your family. Thanks to the generosity of those who have donated to the To Teach Who Christ Is Campaign, we are installing new permanent video cameras and making audio adjustments which will give us much more quality and flexibility in our live streamed presentations. I am grateful for the knowledge and creativity that Brandi Sulak, our Communications Coordinator, has brought to the challenges of integrating technology into our liturgy.

The St. Raymond community remains in my daily prayers and I remain hopeful for the day when I can see more of you in person.

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Romans 15:13)

# Building a parish of our own

St. Raymond's first rectory was a small house located at 222 S. Hi-Lusi Avenue. l'ather O'Brien lived there hen Father Thomas J. O'Brien arrived in Mount Prospect in July of 1949, he was met with open arms – literally. Parishioner Ben Trapani recalls stories about parishioners Les Minoque and Joe Suchy meeting Father O'Brien at the train station and taking him into their homes to help him get started. Not surprisingly, Minoque and Suchy became the parish's first two lay apostles, acting as Father O'Brien's right and left arms.

The parish community celebrated its first Mass (as well as the baptism of its first baby, Jeffrey David Teach) on July 17, 1949 in the basement of Mount Prospect School District 57's old Central School, which was located on the site of the present public


library. Mass was held there for several years until a church building could be completed.

Robert Bluett, a prominent local builder, immediately stepped forward and purchased a small home at the corner of Milburn and Hi-Lusi Avenues (at 222 S. Hi-Lusi Avenue) to serve as a rectory and chapel. And the Catholic women and nuns from St. Theresa Hospital, where Father O'Brien had been chaplain, jumped in and decorated and furnished the little house.

"When we first moved out here in October, 1950, the congregation was meeting in the basement of Central School," recalls Adelaide Thulin, cantor and long-time choir member, and her husband, Fred, one of the

founders of the parish Holy Name Society. "Father O'Brien heard face-to-face confessions in the broom closet and many people went to confession in Des Plaines or Arlington Heights to avoid that. I remember it

feeling a little strange."

Many long-time parishioners including Nell Steinmiller, Marie Jeuck and Thulin recall Father O'Brien baptizing some of their children in his basement chapel on Hi-Lusi. Thulin further recalls Father O'Brien bragging about the fact that his Irish mother had taught him how to keep house and that was why he was able to live in that little house by himself.

Father O'Brien also made it a point to go to each and every new parishioner's house and bless it personally. This seems all the more amazing when you think that the Catholic population of the parish doubled between 1949 and 1951 and that Father O'Brien's flock came from a large geographic area in those days. The parish's original boundaries extended from Palatine Road on the north to Higgins Road on the south and from Wolf Road (north of Northwest Highway) and Mount Prospect Road (south of Northwest Highway) on the east to Forest Avenue (north of Central Road) and Arlington Heights Road (south of Central Road) on the west. It was later to be progressively eaten away at by the formation of such parishes as St. Emily, St. Cecilia, St. Thomas Becket, St. Zachary and St. Alphonsus.



#### Patients at Northwest Community Hospital

In late October we received word from the Spiritual Care Services Department at Northwest Community Hospital that they will no longer send the daily patient census to the Ministry of Care Coordinators at the parishes and other churches. Up to this time, Sr. Val received a confidential listing of St. Raymond parishioners at NCH, enabling us to offer the pastoral care that we want to provide for our parishioners experiencing illness requiring hospital care. Due to this change in policy, there is no way to know if any of our parishioners are at NCH. Therefore, if a loved one has been hospitalized at NCH, we would deeply appreciate a call or email with this information. This is also true for patients at Lutheran General, Alexian Brothers, and Resurrection Hospitals. Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?

Domestic violence victims often report: "I didn't know it was abuse." "I thought I could fix it.", "I didn't tell anyone."
