Dear Parents of Teens of St. Raymond:

We hope that you and your students are settling into the new school year routine even if it looks a bit different than the last. This letter is an invitation for you to welcome Diana Arizmendi as the new Coordinator of Youth and Young Adult Ministry at St. Raymond. We had hoped by now to have had an opportunity for you to meet her in person, but given the current pandemic that has not been a possibility. Despite that, please know that in the short time Diana has been with us, we have been praying for your families, especially the teens as we understand how challenging and isolating this health crisis continues to be for them.

In his letter to young people, *Christus Vivit*, Pope Francis reminds us that “**youth ministry involves two main courses of action... One is outreach, the way we attract new young people to an experience of the Lord. The other is growth, the way we help those who have already had that experience to mature in it.**” What an incredible and awesome responsibility Pope Francis lays out for a parish community to cultivate moments of encounter with our Lord, Jesus Christ. As a parish we are called to be **relevant, engaging and inclusive** for our Church to help teens grow in deeper relationships with Jesus and each other.

We recognize the necessity in continuing to offer opportunities that allow this next generation to explore our faith, create lasting friendships, discuss relevant topics, and find belonging to the larger Church. We are extremely thankful that there is a robust High School Youth Ministry through Branches for over the last 30 years and are excited to continue these efforts by building upon the solid foundation laid before us. Our hope is that Branches Youth Ministry will equip a teen to face the joys and challenges of life and strengthen their conviction of living out our Catholic faith as witnesses to the love of Christ.

The core of the Branches program is meeting in small groups, and this is a value that will be preserved. In the small group setting, teens develop a sense of trust and build community with others in their group. We believe that all teens should have a unified experience within Branches Youth Ministry that will provide them with the encouragement and tools they need to grow deeper in their faith and be aware of God's presence in their lives. In order to provide a consistent experience for all teens, we will be introducing Life Teen resources to our parish. Life Teen provides many resources, curriculum and support for teens, parents and mentors that are relevant and engaging to the lives of the teens. Branches Youth Ministry will continue to meet every two weeks on Sunday evenings as in the past. Our sessions will include a large group gathering where a talk will be given to all teens and after that they will break off into small groups. Sessions will be led by Diana and members of the adult core team mentors will help facilitate small groups and other activities.

As Catholics we are called to foster a great sense of community not just in our own homes or parish but in our surrounding communities at large. Currently, best practices of the Archdiocese of Chicago do not support continued regular youth meetings in homes. Instead, we are asked to host meetings and activities at the parish campus in order to ensure the safety of all participants but also to empower all to grow in community and be more inclusive. For the Branches program in the fall, the Archdiocese is allowing us to host an in-person kickoff event for our program on campus and after that all of our meetings will be held virtually through Zoom until the Archdiocese



determines it is safe for us to resume sessions on the parish campus.


In looking to the future of youth ministry at St. Raymond, we face the challenge of how to welcome all interested teens into Branches Youth Ministry. All recent studies of young adult Catholics who have left the practice of their faith show us how important it is to engage teens. In order to welcome all teens into Branches Youth Ministry we do need to increase our pool of adult mentors. We would like to invite any adults over 21 years old, who feels called to be part of the adult core team of mentors, to contact Diana at [d.arizmendi@st-raymond.org](mailto:d.arizmendi@st-raymond.org) to discuss your interest in being a mentor.

We have seen firsthand that high school students have been asked to pivot in every aspect of their life for the last 6 months and they have done so with resilient grace, compassion, and humility. This gives us great hope that as the parish shifts the way we engage the teens this fall, to align with the current Archdiocese of Chicago guidelines, they will remain open and present to Jesus and His calling.

Please pray, along with us and core team members, that we may continue to be attentive to the calling of the Holy Spirit as we minister to the teens of our community.

All Catholic students in public, private, parochial, or home schools in grades 8 through 12, are invited to participate in the 2020-2021 Knights of Columbus Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest. Students are encouraged to write a 500 to 750 word essay on the theme, *Trusting in God in a Difficult Time*. The local contest is hosted by Mount Prospect Council 6481.

All contestants on the local level receive a participation certificate. Each grade level winner receives a winner certificate and medallion and then advances to the district/regional level of competition. Participants are required to complete an entry form and furnish written parental/guardian consent. ## KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS MT PROSPECT COUNCIL 6481 2020-2021 CATHOLIC CITIZENSHIP ESSAY CONTEST

Mount Prospect Council 6481 again is sponsoring the Knights of Columbus Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest. The essay contest is a creative way to encourage young people to become better citizens firmly grounded in our Faith.

### Eligibility

The Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest is open to all Catholic students — in public, private, parochial, or home schools — in grades 8-12 during the current 2020-2021 school year.

### **2020-2021 Theme: Trusting in God during a Difficult Time**

“Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy.” (1 Peter 1:8)

In an essay of 500-750 words, discuss how trusting in God during a difficult time has helped you or someone you know find the strength and hope to endure it. Consider especially those times when it was a challenge to understand why something was happening. Consider also sharing any lessons about faith and hope you or someone you know may have learned from this experience.

### Guidelines

Essays must reflect the assigned theme and topic and be submitted by the published deadlines.

Essays must be the student's original work.

Essays must be typed on 8½" x 11" paper, one sided, double spaced, one-inch top, bottom, left, and right margins, 12-point typewriter font.

Essays must be between 500 and 750 words long, approximately two-to-three typed pages.

The student's name should only appear on the official Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest entry form, which should be single-stapled to the back of the essay.

Catholic Schools participating in the Contest should submit hard copies of the essays and entry forms.

Individual not associated with a participating Catholic School should submit the essay and entry form by email as PDFs.

All entries and entry forms become the property of the Knights of Columbus and will not be returned.

### Timetable

August/September: Council announces Essay Contest to local Catholic schools and parishes

September: Students write essays; essays should be submitted by September 30, 2020.

Early October: Judges review essays for Council level.

Late October/early November: District/Regional (Archdiocese) judging.

Early November/early December: Jurisdictional (Illinois) judging.

Essays due to the Supreme Council for international judging by December 15.

January/February: International Essay Contest winners announced by the Supreme Council.

### Judging

Judges will be selected by Mount Prospect Council. Knights of Columbus members, teachers, clergy, civic officials, and members of the community may serve as judges.

Essays will be judged on a 100-point scoring system:

35 points — Content: How clearly is the theme presented?

30 points — Grammar: How well is the essay written with respect to essay construction, paragraph construction, sentence structure, spelling, and grammar?

35 points— Style: Does the essay show creativity, imagination, and development of the topic in a compelling style?

### Council Recognition

The Council provides participation certificates. The Council also awards a certificate and a medallion for the winning entry for each grade level. The winning entries advance to the next level of competition.

to educate that the parish was forced to give up its big lower level meeting space and replace it with eight more classrooms in 1957.

"By the time my son, Edward, got to eighth grade in 1960, there were so many eighth graders that they could only go to school half days to accommodate everyone," recalls Marcella Odmark. "Sister Mary Finnbar taught them. Half would go to school from 8 to 11:30 a.m. and the other half would go from noon to 4 p.m. and they would rotate the hours each month. Edward would go in the morning one month and in the afternoon the next month."

With the increased number of students came the need for more Sisters of Mercy to teach them and the house on I-Oka had become overcrowded with eleven nuns living there. So, in September of 1957, construction began on a convent at the corner of Milburn and I-Oka Avenues, just west of the little church.

The convent was constructed to house 16 nuns and a housekeeper. The main floor featured a kitchen, community room, dining area (which they called a "refectory") and work room. Upstairs were the tiny individual sleeping quarters, lavatory facilities and a chapel. In the basement there was a recreation room with a piano, television, ping-pong table and work area, as well as a laundry room and room for storage.

"The nuns were so happy there," recalls Nell Steinmiller. "Marshall Field's did the interior for them and it was beautiful."

By this time the Steinmillers with their eight children were living on the same block as the convent. In fact, they were living right next door at 309 S. I-Oka Avenue.

"We had been living on the other side of the tracks at 220 South Owen Street for six years when Father O'Brien came to Jack in 1956 and suggested that we buy this house on the same block as the church," she recalls.

"Apparently he had tried to buy it for the church from the non-Catholic owners, but they had been reluctant to sell to the church," Steinmiller explains. "So Father O'Brien wanted to get a Catholic family in there because he figured that a Catholic family would be more willing to sell to the church if it later wanted the property."

The church already owned the house just to the south of this one at 311 S. I-Oka. They had purchased the two-story brick and cement home with a screened porch from Harold and Juanita Barnes in June of 1953 for \$21,500. Stan Wozniak, the parish's beloved maintenance man, was living there.

*The Sisters of Mercy were part of the neighborhood. The Steinmiller family with their eight children lived in the first house south of the convent. Next to them was a home, owned by the church, but occupied by Stan Wozniak, parish maintenance man. The third house, which is barely visible, was owned by the Byrne family, which also had eight children.*



The only other private home on the block was at 313 S. I-Oka and it was owned by Andrew and Mary Byrne who, like the Steinmillers, had eight children.

"We all sure enjoyed living by the nuns," Steinmiller says. "We would always freeze our yard in the winter and they would

come over and skate."

Other neighbors also recall the Sisters of Mercy. For instance, Jeanette White recalls driving them around each year to see the Christmas lights. And Marcella Odmark remembers taking the nuns to run errands.

"I became close to one of the nuns and she used to tell me about their lives in the convent," Odmark relates. "She told me that someone read Scripture during each meal and no one was allowed to talk. And the reason they had that butler's pantry area with the sink between the dining area and the kitchen was because the nuns had to wash their own dishes there after each meal."

Once the Sisters were ensconced in their new convent, Father O'Brien and his new assistant, Father Joseph Doyle, moved into the much larger, former convent at 218 S. I-Oka Avenue and the parish sold the original rectory on Hi-Lusi Avenue in August, 1958.

All of this building forced Father O'Brien to always be searching for donations and fund-raisers. "Walgreen's donated four big fans to cool the little old church," parish-

ioner Myron Weigle recalls.

"We used to joke that Father O'Brien was always looking over his shoulder to see who was driving up in the Cadillac," says Marie Pope. "He wanted to know them!"

Ken and Marcella Odmark agree. "Father O'Brien was very nice, but also very close-mouthed. He wouldn't answer questions about the parish finances and he never told anyone how much was collected each week. But he seemed frugal with the church's money, so he was able to get people to donate."

It is important to remember that for much of this time there were no collection envelopes issued, according to Myron Weigle. People just threw their money in the basket and no one knew who gave what.

In September, 1959 Father O'Brien initiated the parish's first "Fair Share" campaign, chaired by Jack Keefer, with help from Eloy Ekkebus and countless others. With the slogan, "Pray, Work, Give," this intense door-to-door solicitation by 400 male parishioner volunteers sought funds, payable over three years, for debt reduction and school expansion. Their goal was to raise no less than \$350,000 because the parish's debt at the time was \$546,000 and they also wanted to build a new larger church and add eight more classrooms to the school.

This was an incredibly well-orchestrated effort with the parish divided into 18 geographic "divisions" and a chairman appointed for each. There was also a special newspaper published each week just to promote the campaign. And a big kick-off dinner was held at Chevy Chase Country Club in Wheeling where Auxiliary Bishop Raymond P. Hillinger was the keynote speaker. The workers at that inspirational dinner pledged \$132,000 toward the goal before they even set foot in the neighborhoods.

The campaign blitz was held on a Sunday afternoon, October 11, 1959, and people were urged by Father O'Brien and their division chairmen to stay home to receive campaign workers and most did!

Myron Weigle, one of the many soldiers in that fund-raising army, recalls, "We did it by block and while some people

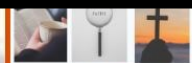
