# RACIAL JUSTICE READING GROUP

In the wake of the murder of George Floyd and the demonstrations in support of Black Lives Matter, Jenny Wiertel, a young adult member of St. Raymond's parish, created a Racial Justice Reading group. From June 29-August 17, Jenny guided a robust, multi-generational group of more than 40 participants in a weekly discussion. We loosely followed the NETWORK Advocates "Recommit to Racial Justice" guide, with additional resources and activities suggested by the members. Due to COVID health concerns, the Racial Justice group gathered over ZOOM each Monday evening for an hour of respectful discussion, information sharing, reflection, and prayer. We followed group guidelines which included: embrace and express discomfort, we are experts on our own experiences, and resolution will not happen today. Jenny and her co-leaders, Tammy King, Ann Hoffman, and Katie Doherty, encouraged us to sit with the topic of that evening, ask questions, and not focus on solving the issue of racism today (or within the 8-week timeline of the group.)

The topics and activities we covered were varied. We learned about the origins of the racial wealth and income gap, the legacies of injustices against Native Americans, and the inequity of health care in America especially as it relates to people of color. We unpacked our invisible backpacks to identify some of the daily effects of white privilege in our lives. Many of us heard the term "redlining" for the first time as we took a deep dive into the injustice of many of the laws that govern our country. We discussed how white is less a racial identity, and more of a privileged legal and economic status. We added the terms Sundown Town, White Savior, and Browning to our vocabulary.

And we prayed. We prayed for understanding. We prayed for victims of violence. We prayed for the Catholic Church to be an ally in the racial justice movement and not a bystander. We prayed for courage to take on beliefs that are bigger than ourselves. And we prayed that the dialogue and understanding started with the Racial Justice Reading Group be just a beginning of an ongoing conversation at St. Raymond's Church.

## What is Life Teen?

Life Teen is a dynamic movement that seeks to lead teens closer to Christ through fellowship, learning, community and prayer. It helps guide teens in discovering their mission as followers of Christ

### Primary Focus

- Build Community to help teens feel connected to the church at both the small and large group level
- Provide relevant and engaging teachings on the Catholic faith to give teens a place to learn and ask questions about the faith.
- Lead teens through prayer, discussion and in-depth teaching of our faith

### What does a session look like?

- Gather: Night begins with an engaging activity/ game
- Proclaim: Dive into an interactive 15-minute Catholic teaching
- Break: split into small group for group-lead discussion. Groups typically remains consistent throughout the year
- Send: Lead teens in different experiences of prayer to encounter Jesus

## Join us for our Fall series "Belong"

Many factors cause teens to experience the pain of isolation and loneliness to a greater degree today and a multitude of solutions often leave them feeling even more alone. *Belong* series addresses the importance of moving from isolation to solitude as well as our need for acceptance and community, which can be found and fostered in the Catholic Church.

### What is a series?

A series is a grouping of 4 nights where the messages are all connected under a common theme. This approach allows for deeper content/discussions into topics over simply brushing over the surface. They are relevant to teen's life in both practical and spiritual way.

### How do small groups work?

Small groups provide the teens with an opportunity to discuss the night's topic in a less intimidating-sized group. We know that a large group experience can be too daunting for some teens to feel comfortable opening up. Teens will get placed in a small group at the beginning of the year, and they will traditionally remain in the same small group with the same leaders throughout the year.

Teens who were part of Branches last year will have the option to remain in their small group or may choose to be part of a new small group.

## *Father Coggins Farewell Homily*



I remember as if it were yesterday. Seven years and five months ago I stood in this very pulpit and announced to all of you that my name was Father Coggins and that I had been selected by Cardinal Meyer to be your new Pastor. It was indeed a very joyous day for me.

Today I have another announcement and it is not a joyous one or a happy one for me to make. Because of persistent ill health I have been forced to resign as Pastor of St. Raymond and Cardinal Cody has reluctantly, yet very graciously, accepted that resignation and has appointed me Pastor Emeritus with permission to live in a climate more advantageous to me.

As some of you know, my health has been steadily declining over the past several years and joined with rapid loss of eyesight, I have been unable to continue in an active capacity. Faced with these facts, I have come to the agonizing conclusion that I have little choice but to step down and leave. Actually, I suppose, I could have stayed on and been Pastor in name only, but no one realizes more than I do

how unfair this would have been to the priests and people alike of this great parish. This parish is so large, so active, so vital that it needs a young energetic Pastor who can be a part of all of its varied activities. To remain as an inactive Pastor would have placed a tremendous burden on my Associate Pastors. As it is, they are attempting to carry a schedule now that should be shared by two additional priests.

These years that I have spent among you were the happiest of my entire priesthood. I am most grateful for your kindness, your sympathy and your understanding over these past years. Truly St. Raymond is the finest parish in the Archdiocese and you, its people, as well as the priests who have served here have made it so. Oh, it would have been so much easier to say goodbye to you today if you had been otherwise. Believe me I shall cherish every memory that I have of your graciousness and your warm, friendly nature. If I have failed any of you during my tenure here I wish now to offer my humble public apology. Every day

of my life, I shall thank Almighty God for His goodness in permitting me to spend these years among you.

As for the future – I intend to live in a climate that will be more propitious for me – preferably the southern part of California. There I hope to achieve a life-long ambition – to work among our Indian brothers. I have been asked to take over two of the many Indian reservations close to San Diego. I expect to depart for my new assignment within two weeks.

Before I leave, however, I do have several requests to make of you. I do not know who the new Pastor is to be, but I ask that you give him the same cooperation and love that you have given to me. To be a Pastor today in our ever changing world is not an easy task and he will need every bit of understanding, loyalty and generosity of which you are capable.

I have always said that St. Raymond has the most wonderful priests in the world and that is certainly true at this time. It has been a privilege and a high honor to be associated with truly dedi-

cated priests such as Fathers Kalas, Carroll and Kiepora. They are truly noble men of God. (Deacon Mike Kelly has been among us only a short time, but all of you must be aware of his tireless energy and unfailing good humor.) The Church of tomorrow will be in good hands with such men. I wish to thank the Sisters of Mercy for their unselfish work here among us for these many years. We are all deeply indebted to them for the task of educating our youth.

What can I say to you dearly beloved people of St. Raymond? Only that I take away the fondest memories of a truly wonderful people. I ask for the kindness of your prayers that God will give me a few more years of fruitful service in a new part of His vineyard. I promise to remember each and every one of you in my daily Mass and Holy Communion, that Almighty God will continue to bless you, to guide you and to direct you. May you live in the protected shadow of His love forever! God bless you and keep you always close to His Sacred Heart. Goodbye. \*

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior. It is used to exert power and control over another person. It is found in the context of a dating, family or household relationship.

Questions to ask:

- Does your partner isolate you from family and friends?
- Are you being physically, psychologically, economically or sexually abused?
- Is your partner attempting to destroy your self-esteem and self-confidence?


