The Apostles Creed:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

<u>1st Luminous Mystery - The Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan</u>

As Christ descends into the waters, the heavens open wide and the voice of the Father declares "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased," while the Spirit descends on him to entrust him with the mission which he is to carry out.

2nd Luminous Mystery - The Wedding Feast at Cana

The first of the signs is given at Cana, when Christ changes water into wine and opens the hearts of the disciples to faith, thanks to the intervention of Mary, the first among believers.

3rd Luminous Mystery - The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God

4th Luminous Mystery - The Transfiguration of Jesus

The glory of God shines forth from the face of Jesus as the Father commands the astonished Apostles to 'listen to him' and to prepare to experience with him what was to come. Jesus revealed a small portion of His glory in His transfiguration to encourage his disciples, and us, filling us with hope for the rest of our journey.

5th Luminous Mystery – The Institution of the Eucharist

Additional prayers to St. Joseph:


Pope Francis announced a Year of St. Joseph, in honor of the 150th anniversary of the saint's proclamation as patron of the Universal Church, beginning Dec. 8, 2020, concluding Dec. 8, 2021. Pope Francis said he was establishing the year so that "every member of the faithful, following his example, may strengthen their life of faith daily in the complete fulfillment of God's will." Pope Francis said the coronavirus pandemic has heightened his desire to reflect on St. Joseph, as so many people during the pandemic have made hidden sacrifices to protect others, just as St. Joseph quietly protected and cared for Mary and Jesus. "Each of us can discover in Joseph -- the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence -- an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble," the pope wrote. He also said he wanted to highlight St. Joseph's role as a father who served his family with charity and humility, adding, "Our world today needs fathers."
