

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

On Sunday, August 8, St. Raymond Parish will renew our covenant with St. Mark Lutheran Church. This covenant, first signed in 1999, was made possible by the Joint Declaration on Justification by Faith between the Roman Catholic Church and the Lutheran World Federation in 1998. The path to the Joint Declaration began with Pope John Paul II's visit to Germany in 1980, and his discussion of the need for dialogue concerning liturgical and sacramental practice with Bishop Edward Lohse of the Evangelical Church in Germany.

The Joint Declaration flowed from the desire of the Second Vatican Council that the Catholic Church contribute to the unity of Christians. Vatican II recognized that baptism is a sacrament in which all Christians share. As the Council reestablished the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, it recognized that Christians baptized with water in the name of the Trinity do not need to be re-baptized to become members of the Catholic Church. After Vatican II, we stopped referring to our Christians sisters and brothers in Protestant traditions as "separated brethren". The Catholic Church recognizes genuine manifestations of the grace of God in this diversity of "ecclesial communities". With Vatican II, the Catholic Church entered the ecumenical movement seeking Christian unity, which had already been engaged by Orthodox and Protestant traditions since the establishment of the World Council of Churchesin 1948.

The separation of Protestants from the Catholic Church in the 15th and 16th centuries was centered in a return to the Bible. The Protestant Reformers proposed that the Catholic Church has departed from the Biblical understanding of God's grace of salvation freely offered to those who believe in Jesus, and emphasized "salvation by works" based on receiving sacraments dispensed to them by the clergy, who controlled access to grace. The Protestant Reformers insisted that we are justified (place in right relationship with God) by faith alone.

The Joint Declaration stated: "All people are called to salvation in Christ. Through Christ alone we are justified, when we receive this salvation in faith. Faith is itself God's gift through the Holy Spirit who works through word and sacrament in the community of believers...By the action of the Holy Spirit in baptism we are granted the gift of salvation, which lays the basis for the whole Christian life."

The common statement that sinners cannot turn to God by themselves, or merit justification before God, or attain salvation by their own abilities, defused the dispute over a possible contribution by persons to their own justification, although it was recognized that Catholics and Lutherans express this point in theirown languages, with their own special accents. So, as a result of the Joint Declaration, the mutual condemnations of Catholics and Lutherans of the Reformation era were lifted.

As all Christians face the challenges of social and cultural changes to the life of faith, it is more important than ever for Christians to be able to share our faith from a standpoint of unity and agreement, rather than division and argument. In our covenant with St. Mark, we are committed to "strive toward the removal of impediments to the causes of unity, work together for the common good and for peace and justice as an essential response to the Gospel, and encourage our pastoral leadership to cooperate on common matters of pastoral care." This commitment has already borne fruit in collaboration on PADS ministry to the homeless, shared Vacation Bible School, shared Stations of the Cross, 4th of July shopping cart brigade, collecting for the food pantry, and a Shared Stained Glass Window Tour. The women of the communities have had combined meetings, and both Parish Councils have come together to share the joys and the challenges both churches have experienced.

We pray together that our continued commitment to this covenant will be an answer to the prayer of Jesus that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may know that you sent me. (John 17:21)

PART ONE "WE AFFIRM"

Our Covenant calls us to pray jointly, strive for, work towards, encourage others, actively collaborate, share, study and discuss as we make the journey that will one day bring us to full communion. But until that day, we will celebrate everything we have in common.

With this second section of our Covenant in mind, every time the St. Mark / St. Raymond group meets to review a past shared experience or event, we ask ourselves two questions...Where do we go from here and how do we grow from here? As we continue our journey into the future, may we always proudly proclaim in everything we do that we are all disciples of our Lord, Jesus Christ.
