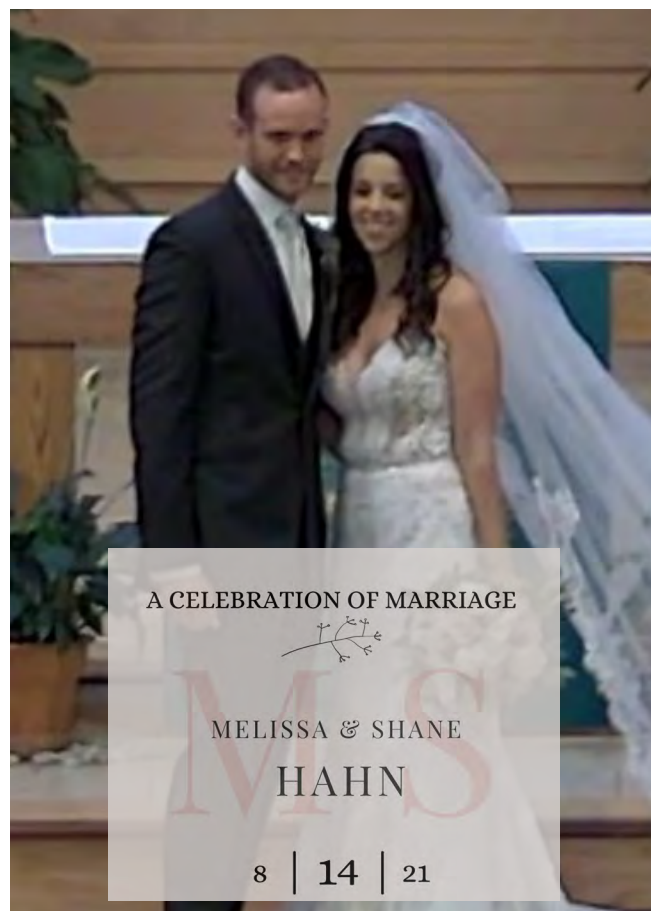

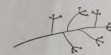

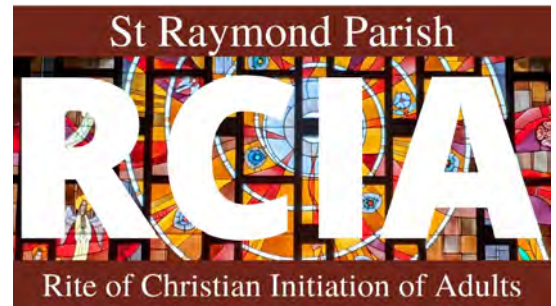

One of the most important aspects of our life at St. Raymond Parish is our continued efforts to share our faith with others. We do this in so many ways: through our liturgies, formation and education programs, outreach programs and our socializing and hospitality. We continually strive to create an atmosphere where God's active presence will be discovered among us.

Sometimes all we need is a gentle invitation -- a little encouragement from someone to do something that we've been thinking about for a long time -- a little encouragement to stop putting something off -- and recognize that perhaps now is the time to take action. We encourage you, our parishioners, to prayerfully consider people you know -- a

spouse, friend, relative, co-worker, or neighbor -- and invite them to explore our faith.

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is designed for women and men who have never been baptized or who were baptized in another Christian denomination and are considering becoming Catholic. It is also appropriate for baptized Catholics who have received little formal religious education or who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation.

The RCIA is a wonderful process, involving some of our own parishioners who accompany the candidates on their faith journey. ST. RAYMOND DE PEÑAFORT RACIAL JUSTICE LEARNING GROUP

Learning to be anti-racist is a re-education process. Pope Francis is calling us to this work. With God, we can open our hearts to hearing and heeding this call. Becoming aware of where we might falter can allow God in to help heal us and change us. Consider this . . .

COMMON RACIST ATTITUDE OR BELIEF #1: "I'M COLORBLIND"

"PEOPLE ARE JUST PEOPLE; I DON'T SEE COLOR."

"I DON'T THINK OF YOU AS CHINESE."

Reality Check and Consequence:

Statements like these assume that people of color are just like us, and have the same dreams, standards, problems, peeves that we do. "Colorblindness" negates the cultural values, norms, expectations and life experiences of people of color. Even if an individual white person could ignore a person's color, the society does not. By saying we don't see their color, we are also saying we don't see our whiteness.

This denies their experience of racism and our experience of privilege.

"I'm colorblind" can also be a defense when afraid to discuss racism, especially if one assumes all conversation about race or color is racist. As my friend Sandy says, "I don't mind that you notice that I'm Black." Color consciousness does not equal racism.

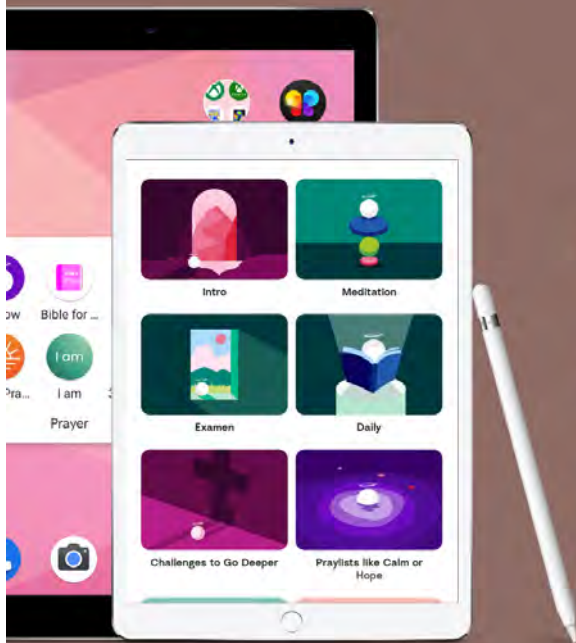

ST. MONICA WAS BORN IN 329 IN NORTH AFRICA. SHE WAS A CHRISTIAN, BUT HER HUSBAND PAGAN. HE CONVERTED BEFORE HE DIED.

HER SON AUGUSTINE WORKED AS A LITURGIST, A LIFE OF SIN AND OBSCURITY. HE LEARNED FROM THE GREAT BISHOP, SAINT AMBROSE.

AUGUSTINE WAS VERY SMART BUT STUBBORN. MONICA PRAYED AND KEPT FOR HIM.

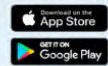

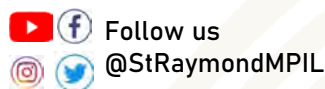
