A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark.
When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come
from Jerusalem,

with unwashed hands, as is, unwashed, Jewish
custom, they asked him, "Why do you teach that
it is lawful for the Pharisees and the scribes to eat

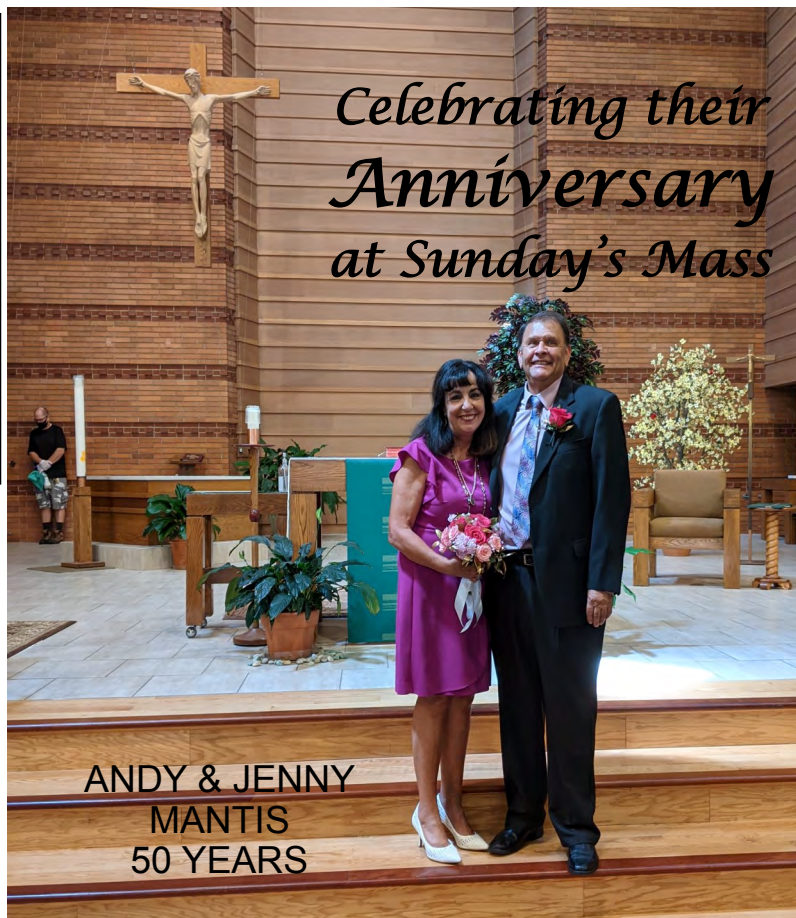

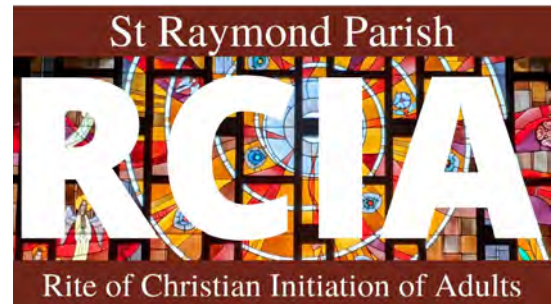

ST. RAYMOND DE PEÑAFORT RACIAL JUSTICE LEARNING GROUP

Learning to be anti-racist is a re-education process. Pope Francis is calling us to this work. With God, we can open our hearts to hearing and heeding this call. Becoming aware of where we might falter can allow God in to help heal us and change us. Consider this . . .

COMMON RACIST ATTITUDE OR BELIEF #1: "I'M COLORBLIND"

"PEOPLE ARE JUST PEOPLE; I DON'T SEE COLOR."
"I DON'T THINK OF YOU AS CHINESE."

Reality Check and Consequence:

Statements like these assume that people of color are just like us, and have the same dreams, standards, problems, peeves that we do. "Colorblindness" negates the cultural values, norms, expectations and life experiences of people of color. Even if an individual white person could ignore a person's color, the society does not. By saying we don't see their color, we are also saying we don't see our whiteness.

This denies their experience of racism and our experience of privilege.

"I'm colorblind" can also be a defense when afraid to discuss racism, especially if one assumes all conversation about race or color is racist. As my friend Sandy says, "I don't mind that you notice that I'm Black." Color consciousness does not equal racism.

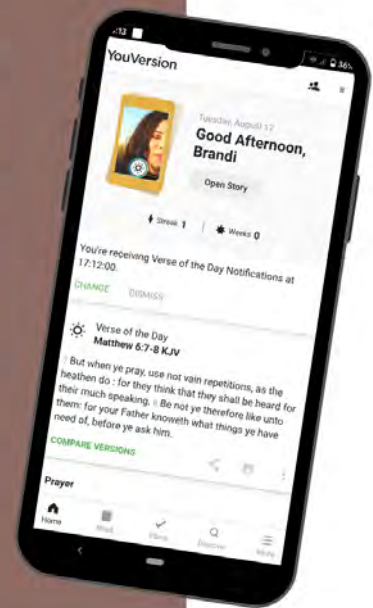

In Fr. Scott's homily from Sunday, August 15, 2021 he has challenged us all to make your cell phone a place where the word of God comes into your life. Here are some examples:

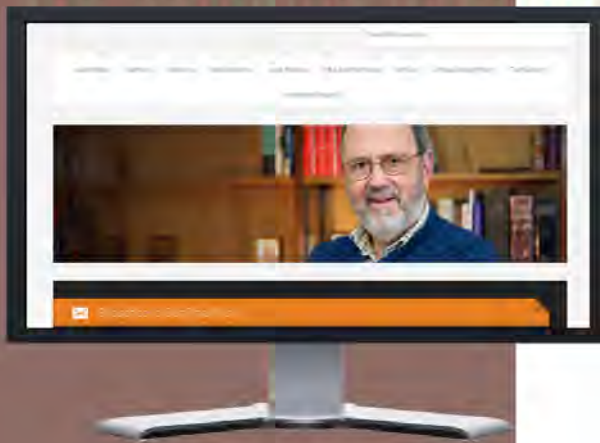

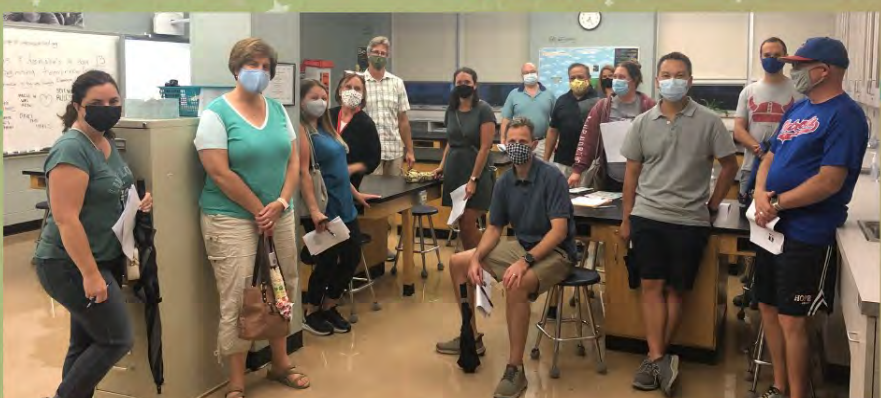
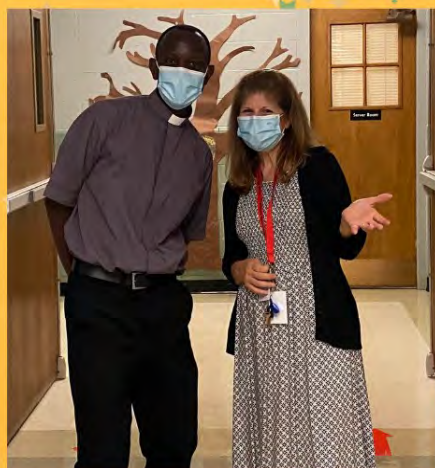


Faculty & Staff Connect with Families

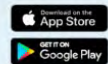

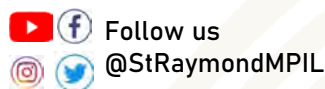
