

AN ANNIVERSARY OPPORTUNITY

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

"Where's the tabernacle?" This is a question that is often asked by visitors to St. Raymond.

In all pre-Vatican II churches, the tabernacle was located in the center behind the altar. The priest faced the tabernacle, with his back to the people, as he celebrated Mass. After the Second Vatican Council, there was a renewed desire to focus attention on the presence of Jesus in all the dimensions of the Mass. The priest then faced the people as a more visible part of the gathered community. The tabernacle was often moved, so that the Eucharist was not visible from the very beginning of Mass, and the gradual revelation of Christ could be better appreciated - "first in the faithful gathered in his name, then in his Word as the Scriptures are read and explained, and finally in a unique way in the Eucharist." (*Instruction on the Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery* 55)

As the insights of the Council were applied, the general recommendation for parish practice stated that: "As a rule, each church should have only one tabernacle, and this tabernacle must be safe and inviolable...The Blessed Sacrament should be reserved in a solid, inviolable tabernacle in the middle of the main altar or on a side altar, but in a truly prominent place. Alternatively, according to legitimate customs and in individual cases to be decided by the local bishop, it may be placed in some other part of the church which is really worthy and properly equipped." (*Instruction on the Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery* 52, 54).

The recommendations led to different designs in different churches. There was a desire to balance focus on the Eucharist in the church with opportunity for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. In Holy Name Cathedral in our own archdiocese, the tabernacle is located in a dedicated space to the side of the altar. At the same time, permission was given for some parish churches to be designed like St. Raymond, in which the tabernacle was placed in a side chapel, instead of in the church.

As we move into the 21st century, we face the unique challenge of sharing the gospel with people who have had little contact with the Christian faith, and with Catholics who have become distanced from the teachings of the faith. A Pew Research Center poll in 2019 found that only 31% of Catholics clearly understand and believe in the actual presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The visibility of the tabernacle in the church is increasingly important as the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is less understood.

As we seek to evangelize and to attract people to our community, we see the importance of reminding both Catholics, as well as people exploring Christianity and Catholicism for the first time, that the Lord is constantly present with us in the sacrament of the Eucharist. We are called to be missionary disciples of Christ, and this journey will require strength and understanding that can only be found in the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It is the

presence of the power of Jesus in the Eucharist that makes us into the Body of Christ in the world. If that is not central to our spirituality, we cannot fulfill our mission. ***Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also those who feed on me will have life because of me.*** (John 6:57)

In honor of the 60th anniversary of the laying of the cornerstone of St. Raymond Church in 1961, I would like to offer the community an opportunity to give the tabernacle a more prominent place in our worship space. I would like to invite the St. Raymond community to support a project of relocating the tabernacle from the prayer chapel to the church. This relocation project will also entail some remodeling of the chapel. The chapel will continue to serve as the prayer and adoration chapel. We will enhance the dedicated chapel space to add a focus for the monstrance used in Adoration, while keeping the chapel a peaceful oasis of prayer.

This project will be made possible solely by contributions given for this specific purpose. So it is really up to the people of St. Raymond to make it possible for us to go forward with this project. I would like to set a goal of raising \$200,000. This will enable us to complete the project at a high level of quality that will enhance our worship space. Should any donated funds remain following completion of the project, they will go to the account designated for the future maintenance and improvement of the St. Raymond campus.

I invite you to prayerfully consider participating in this project. It is important to note that this is an invitation to give above and beyond regular giving to the parish. Please do not divert funds from your regular giving to this project. Please make donations by check payable to ST. RAYMOND with TABERNACLE PROJECT noted in the Memo line. 




Do You Know Someone Who Might Be Interested In Becoming Catholic?




Each year all the parishes send their RCIA candidates, sponsors and team to Holy Name Cathedral for the "Rite of Election." There are so many people involved that this prayer service is offered five times during Lent – and the cathedral is filled each time.

One of the most important aspects of our life at St. Raymond Parish is our continued efforts to share our faith with others. We do this in so many ways: through our liturgies, formation and education programs, outreach programs and our socializing and hospitality. We continually strive to create an atmosphere where God's active presence will be discovered among us.

Sometimes all we need is a gentle invitation -- a little encouragement from someone to do something that we've been thinking about for a long time -- a little encouragement to stop putting something off -- and recognize that perhaps now is the time to take action. We encourage you, our parishioners, to prayerfully consider people you know -- a spouse, friend, relative, co-worker, or neighbor -- and invite them to explore our faith.

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is designed for women and men who have never been baptized or who were baptized in another Christian denomination and are considering becoming Catholic. It is also appropriate for baptized Catholics who have received little formal religious education or who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation.



The RCIA is a wonderful process, involving some of our own parishioners who accompany the candidates on their faith journey. RACIAL JUSTICE LEARNING GROUP

Learning to actively promote racial tolerance, to overcome prejudices, and to resist discrimination is a re-education process for many of us. Becoming aware of where we can grow in our call to love one another as God loves us, can allow God to help heal and change us. With God, we can open our hearts to hearing and heeding this call.

THIS MONTH'S DISCUSSION TOPIC:

ARE PREJUDICE AND RACISM THE SAME?

TO ANSWER THIS QUESTION, LET'S DEFINE SOME TERMS:

- A **prejudice** is "the favorable or unfavorable opinion or feeling about a person or group, usually formed without knowledge or thought." It can be based on one experience which is transferred to all potential experiences.
- While **racism** is a system of structuring opportunity and assigning value based on physical properties such as skin color and hair texture.
 - This unfairly disadvantages some individuals and groups and damages their physical and mental health. Its effects range from daily interpersonal interactions to race-based opportunities for good education, housing, employment, etc. It is reflected in disparities in, but not limited to, health, wealth, income, justice, and voting.
 - Racism also unfairly advantages individuals belonging to socially and politically dominant racial groups. Thus, it is possible for all racial groups to hold racial prejudices against other groups but it is not possible for all racial groups to be racist against other groups.
 - Racism is sometimes categorized as structural, institutional, interpersonal, and internalized.

Please reflect upon this: There can be racial prejudice against white people, but not racism, because our current society is structured to protect and preference white people over people of color.
