Our Junior High RE students came together for a creative evening making greeting cards for neighboring nursing homes.





Backpack Ministry partnered with D59 and provided large monthly boxes of food for October, November, and December for 15 families. Included in the boxes are multiple meals for breakfast, lunch, and dinner to help bridge the gap over the weekend. We also included some fun toys, activity books/crayons, and some candy for Thanksgiving and Christmas. We've also provided snacks to social workers to hand out to children in need during the daytime.

We will continue our giving in 2022 in the same vein—monthly boxes of food rather than weekly deliveries. This method allows us to pack all supplies outdoors (or in our home garages), and we've streamlined our delivery to avoid unnecessary contacts during this time of COVID. In 2022 we will reach out to District 26 again to see if they want to be added back to our distribution, as they declined due to the federal subsidies already received.



This year the Saint Raymond Afghan Group was able to send a donation to the Wings program of 85 afghans and blankets for the residents and children in this year's program. Each year we make this donation but the number is not always this large. Our group has worked very hard to fulfill this request. We also sent scarves to the group making mats for the homeless.
