Dear Parishioners,

As I begin my third week at Saint Raymond, I wish to express my gratitude for the warm welcome I have received. Last Sunday, I spoke about this being a time of transition. A transition is a process or a period of changing from what is now to what will be. There are moments of transition in all of our lives. As a priest, there is a major transition when moving from one parish community to another, experiencing the impact personally and on the parish community.

Fr. Scott, last week at the 5:00 pm Mass modeled this as he offered a Mass of Thanksgiving as he transitions from the role of a pastor into retirement from full-time ministry. At that Mass, Fr. Scott in a sense passed the baton to me as his successor.

The late Fr. Bernie Piterzak used to say that he was "becoming" the pastor of Saint Raymond or Saint Anne. I agree with that sentiment. It takes time for a priest to get a handle on all the nuances and needs of a parish community. While I have served as a pastor for over 21 years, every parish is different and the needs that are before us post-pandemic require creativity and perseverance. While I have jumped into the role of pastor with enthusiasm and a desire to lead collaboratively, there is much that will simply take time to plan and develop. My first two weeks have been very full as my Associate Pastor, Fr. Rodlin is currently back home in Haiti until the 23rd. I am also still in the process of moving into the "Pastors House" and

getting set up in the PMC. I have been trying to unpack one box each day. Kurt Dombrowski from our parish maintenance team has been painting my living room and other details to get me fully moved in. Other parishioners have helped with the cleaning and organizing of the main kitchen. The



parish staff have been most generous with their time and have been very patient with me as I meet with them and try to address the most pressing issues. I am grateful for the staff that Fr. Scott has left me. At this time, I continue to ask for your patience. I simply cannot do everything all at once. The sacramental needs of this community always come first. I will continue to prioritize which needs are most pressing.

This week at the Liturgy meeting we discussed our Lenten Schedule and will be communicating this to



the parish soon.

There will be a number of special opportunities for us to gather for prayer, reflection, and

service. Our Lenten Theme is: "A journey of 1000 miles begins with a single step." This Lent we will be offering an opportunity to explore what it

means to be a pilgrim and a disciple rejoicing in God's love for us! I am grateful to Jill Heinking for organizing these special opportunities we planned before I arrived. Please save the following Saturdays;
